Demographic Profile

The population in Camp County, Texas was 12,543 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 5,509 with a participation rate of 57.6%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Camp County, Texas, 19.9% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in Camp County, Texas is \$53,968 and the median house value is \$146,600.



Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for Camp County, Texas was 5.0% as of February 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.2%. One year earlier, in February 2023, the unemployment rate in Camp County, Texas was 5.2%.




Unemployment Rate for Camp County, Texas

Wage Trends

The average worker in Camp County, Texas earned annual wages of \$50,762 as of 2023Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 8.5% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$69,861 in the nation as of 2023Q4.

Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2023Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 7.8% lower in Camp County, Texas than the U.S. average.

About This Report

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Camp County, Texas is Management Occupations, employing 639 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (440 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (366). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 13.50), Management Occupations (1.88), and Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (1.29).

Occupation groups in Camp County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$103,500), Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$88,500), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$88,500). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.8% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 8.4% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Camp County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.3% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Management Occupations (+6 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+4). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (72 jobs) and Management Occupations (59).



Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2023Q3, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4. Wages by occupation are as of 2023 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Camp County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Agricultural with a location quotient of 24.92. This cluster employs 911 workers in the region with an average wage of \$41,204. Employment in the Agricultural cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.7% per year over the next ten years.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Camp County, Texas is projected to grow 1.0% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.6% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.3% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.3% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

About This Report

Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2022, nominal GDP in Camp County, Texas expanded 12.7%. This follows growth of 14.9% in 2021. As of 2022, total GDP in Camp County, Texas was \$502,535,000.




1 year % Change in GDP

Of the sectors in Camp County, Texas, Utilities contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2022, \$88,210,000 The nextlargest contributions came from Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (\$84,402,000); Wholesale Trade (\$74,336,000); and Health Care and Social Assistance (\$34,222,000).
