Demographic Profile

The population in Lamar County, Texas was 50,149 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 23,806 with a participation rate of 60.4%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Lamar County, Texas, 20.1% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in Lamar County, Texas is \$58,246 and the median house value is \$152,800.



About This Report

Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for Lamar County, Texas was 4.4% as of February 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.2%. One year earlier, in February 2023, the unemployment rate in Lamar County, Texas was 5.1%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through February 2024.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Lamar County, Texas earned annual wages of \$50,476 as of 2023Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.9% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$69,861 in the nation as of 2023Q4.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2023Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 8.4% lower in Lamar County, Texas than the U.S. average.

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Lamar County, Texas is Production Occupations, employing 3,592 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (2,600 workers) and Management Occupations (2,134). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 2.63), Healthcare Support Occupations (1.38), and Construction and Extraction Occupations (1.19).

Occupation groups in Lamar County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$105,600), Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$94,900), and Management Occupations (\$92,000). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.6% among Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations to 6.5% among Transportation and Material Moving Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Lamar County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+34 jobs) and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+21). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Production Occupations (396 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (368).



Wages by occupation are as of 2023 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

About This Report

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Lamar County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Wood/Paper with a location quotient of 5.80. This cluster employs 1,070 workers in the region with an average wage of \$68,601. Employment in the Wood/Paper cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.2% per year over the next ten years.



Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Lamar County, Texas is projected to grow 0.8% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.3% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.1% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.2% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2022, nominal GDP in Lamar County, Texas expanded 9.6%. This follows growth of 13.9% in 2021. As of 2022, total GDP in Lamar County, Texas was \$2,783,404,000.

Of the sectors in Lamar County, Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2022, \$1,183,331,000 The next-largest contributions came from Health Care and Social Assistance (\$257,413,000); Retail Trade (\$216,261,000); and Construction (\$157,986,000).
