

Morris County Economic Overview 2024

Demographic Profile

The population in Morris County, Texas was 11,993 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 5,281 with a participation rate of 55.1%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Morris County, Texas, 14.6% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in Morris County, Texas is \$51,532 and the median house value is \$108,600.



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Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for Morris County, Texas was 6.3% as of February 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.2%. One year earlier, in February 2023, the unemployment rate in Morris County, Texas was 6.5%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through February 2024.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Morris County, Texas earned annual wages of \$51,966 as of 2023Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.8% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$69,861 in the nation as of 2023Q4.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2023Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 11.5% lower in Morris County, Texas than the U.S. average.

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Morris County, Texas is Production Occupations, employing 573 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Management Occupations (407 workers) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (385). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 2.70), Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (1.49), and Management Occupations (1.42).

Occupation groups in Morris County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$99,500), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$89,500), and Management Occupations (\$87,300). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 2.4% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 9.6% among Transportation and Material Moving Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Morris County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.5% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+2 jobs) and Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (+1). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Production Occupations (58 jobs) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (45).



Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2023Q3, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4. Wages by occupation are as of 2023 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Morris County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Metal & Product Mfg. with a location quotient of 19.49. This cluster employs 540 workers in the region with an average wage of \$89,977. Employment in the Metal & Product Mfg. cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.5% per year over the next ten years.




Industry Clusters for Morris County, Texas as of 2023Q4

Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Morris County, Texas is projected to contract 0.1% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.5% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.3% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.2% per year.




Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

Employment by occupation data are estimates are as of 2023Q4. Education levels of occupations are based on BLS assignments. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2022, nominal GDP in Morris County, Texas expanded 8.2%. This follows growth of 11.6% in 2021. As of 2022, total GDP in Morris County, Texas was \$564,311,000.

Of the sectors in Morris County, Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2022, \$311,661,000 The next-largest contributions came from Wholesale Trade (\$71,186,000); Educational Services (\$25,465,000); and Retail Trade (\$23,137,000).
