Articulation Agreement Addendum Collin College and The University of Texas at Tyler

Collin County Community College District (Collin College) and The University of Texas at Tyler (UT Tyler) hereby agree to attach the following Guided Pathway agreement from an A.A.S. in a healthcare concentration (listed below) to the B.A.A.S. degree in Healthcare Management to the articulation agreement signed in July of 2021 (Collin College) and August of 2021 (UT Tyler). The UT Tyler program is currently at approximately 50% capacity.

Should the Collin College Bachelor of Applied Science in Clinical Operations Management close any time during its first five years, a teach-out plan will be developed such that:

- The obligations pursuant to this Agreement for a teach-out shall terminate when all Collin
 College students accepted by UT Tyler enter the UT Tyler Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences
 degree program pursuant to this Agreement have graduated from UT Tyler, have failed to be
 continuously enrolled at UT-Tyler, or six years have passed from the date of this agreement,
 whichever comes first.
- UT Tyler will accept all credits with grades of "C" or higher from courses designated on the Collin
 College transcript as part of the Bachelor of Applied Science in Clinical Operations Management
 for application to the UT Tyler's Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree, Healthcare
 Management thematic concentration. The credits from Collin College would be applied as
 degree requirements or elective credit, as appropriate. Unless the student is designated as Core
 Complete (general education requirements) on the Collin College transcript, students must earn
 a grade of "C" or higher on all Texas core curriculum courses.
- Any Collin College student who fails to apply, be accepted, and matriculate at UT Tyler by the Fall 2028 semester shall be excluded from this Agreement.
- Students enrolling under this agreement will be required to meet UT Tyler's 120 credit hour program length requirement.
- UT Tyler will permanently house the records of Collin College students who officially enroll at UT
 Tyler pursuant to this Agreement. The records will be sent from Collin College to UT Tyler within
 10 days of each student finalizing enrollment and semester payment at UT Tyler.
- UT Tyler will accept only students who are in good social and academic standing according to the Collin College policies as of the time of transfer.

AN ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Between

Statement of Purpose:

This agreement documents the collaboration between institutions to increase the educational opportunities for students living in the regions served by Collin County Community College District (Collin College) and The University of Texas at Tyler. The University of Texas at Tyler (UT Tyler) offers courses of study leading to baccalaureate, masters, and doctoral degrees. Collin College provides coursework at the freshman and sophomore levels which leads to various certifications and associate degree of arts or science (AA or AS), associate of applied sciences (AAS), and associate of arts in teaching (AAT). Collin College also provides coursework leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing or the Bachelor of Applied Technology in Cybersecurity. In an effort to maximize the resources available through UT Tyler and Collin College, this Articulation Agreement is intended to create an efficient transfer process and assist students in completing their educational objectives. Additionally, the purpose of this Agreement is to provide guidelines and areas of responsibility ensuring students completing courses at Collin College will be able to maximize the number of courses transferred into the BAAS degree at UT Tyler.

In order to establish and improve the transfer process for our students, we agree to the terms and conditions below:

General Terms and Conditions:

- Collin College students, who meet UT Tyler admission requirements and have earned 60 semester credit hours, or complete the Associate of Applied Science degree with at least a 2.00 cumulative GPA, will receive admission to UT Tyler to pursue the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science (BAAS) degree program.
- 2. UT Tyler and Collin college will jointly develop online transfer pathway documents. By creating these online pathway documents, UT Tyler and Collin College will facilitate the transfer of courses within the AAS degree into the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science degree as appropriate. These pathways will be published on the websites of each institution.

- UT Tyler will encourage Collin College students to complete the AAS degree either before
 matriculation to UT Tyler or by reverse transfer of credit following admission to and
 attendance at UT Tyler.
- 4. UT Tyler agrees to provide transfer students with information regarding the availability of transfer scholarships for eligible students, as well as, other financial aid opportunities at UT Tyler.
- 5. UT Tyler agrees to provide transfer students with information regarding academic supports to assist them in their academic career at UT Tyler prior to coming to campus. Regardless of this advance notice, UT Tyler expects Collin College students to attend all required academic orientations for transfer students.
- 6. Collin College will publicize and help facilitate campus visits by UT Tyler recruiters and will prominently display UT Tyler posters and literature, as well as, provide suitable space for a UT Tyler recruiter to advise students on the Collin College campus. Collin College will publish the degree pathways on their website and provide annual contact information for their students who may be eligible for these programs for communication and recruitment efforts to UT Tyler.
- 7. This Articulation Agreement shall be filed with the Offices of the President and Provosts, as well as, with the Admissions and Registrar's Offices at each institution.
- 8. This Articulation Agreement shall remain effective for five (5) years from the date of the last signature, or until one (1), or both, institutions deem it necessary to amend or terminate it. The desire to amend or terminate the Agreement must be submitted in writing to the President of the partnering institution.

Transfer of Credit:

Students transferring to UT Tyler under this agreement will receive credit for hours earned with the following conditions:

- 1. Students will receive academic credit toward the UT Tyler Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science degree for transferrable college level courses only, completed with a grade of "C" or better. Remedial and developmental courses will not be accepted in transfer. Grades of "D" earned in core curriculum courses from Collin College can only be used if transferred in as part of a Collin College's completed core curriculum.
- UT Tyler will accept up to 87 credit hours from Collin College in transfer towards the UT Tyler Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science degree.
- 3. At least 33 hours of credit toward the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Science degree must be earned through instruction at UT Tyler. This varies from other UT Tyler degrees that require that 42 hours of upper division coursework be earned at UT Tyler.
- 4. Students transferring prior to completion of the core curriculum shall be awarded transfer credit in each core component area completed.

Reverse Transfer:

- Students transferring prior to the completion of the associate degree will be eligible for the award of associate degree from Collin College upon reverse transfer from UT Tyler, as determined by Collin College.
- UT Tyler will provide Collin College with transcripts of students transferring under this agreement to facilitate the awarding of associate degrees, subject to applicable state and federal laws.

Financial Aid:

Once the student is concurrently enrolled, students will be advised by Collin College, as well as, the University of Texas at Tyler Financial Aid Offices of the benefits of participating in the Financial Aid Consortium Agreement. Students selected for this program will be required to identify the University of Texas at Tyler as their home institution and list UT Tyler on their Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The student should understand that the University of Texas at Tyler will administer and distribute their financial aid with appropriate coordination outlined in the Financial Aid Memorandum of Understanding with Collin College and they cannot receive financial aid at more than one institution during any enrolled semester. Because semester billing dates are not synchronized the host school will take any steps necessary to ensure the concurrently enrolled student will not be dropped from enrollment while financial aid is being processed at UT Tyler.

Agreement Maintenance:

All amendments, notices, requests of other communications relating to maintaining current, accurate information for the execution of this Agreement shall be made in writing and delivered to these contact persons;

The parties to this Agreement agree to pursue mediation of disputes as the first resort. If mediation fails, other legal remedies may be pursued. If a legal action is instituted or a claim is filed in connection with any dispute arising out of or related to this Agreement, the parties agree that jurisdiction and venue for such disputes will be in Smith County, Texas if brought against UT Tyler and in Collin County, Texas if brought against Collin College.

This agreement begins with the August, 2021 term, and continues indefinitely for all future terms until either part cancels it. Federal Title IV aid regulations authorize schools to use consortium agreements to coordinate aid for students who will enroll at different schools during the same aid award period. This agreement covers all financial aid applicants who enroll in the joint Collin

College and The University of Texas at Tyler Academic Progression Partnership program. Students in this program are considered degree seeking at both institutions (Associate of Applied Science Degree at Collin College and Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences Degree at The University of Texas at Tyler).

- The Home school is responsible for all financial aid functions including; determining aid eligibility and awards, disbursing aid, monitoring academic progress, keeping aid records, returning aid funds, and federal reporting requirements.
- The Host school agrees not to award any Federal Title IV or State aid to students during the terms that they are enrolled in the Academic Progression Partnership program.
- After all Home school charges are paid, the Home school will disburse any excess aid to
 the students as financial aid refund checks, which will reimburse them for payments that
 they will have already made to the Host school.

Host School Financial Aid Office Responsibilities:

After registration begins for each term, the Host school must submit the following reports to the Home school's Financial Aid Office according to the following schedule. (Reports should include all students enrolled in the Academic Progression Partnership who register for any courses at the Host school during that term.)

Financial Aid Data Reports:

 On a bi-weekly basis, the Host school's Financial Aid Office must send the Home school's Financial Aid Office a report of any new aid offers (private scholarships, institutional grants, etc.) to these students. The report must include the students' date of birth, LAST name, FIRST name, the Semester/Term, award type or name, term award amounts, and annual award amounts.

- In addition to the regularly scheduled reports above, the Host school agrees to provide student data as needed by the Home school's Financial Aid Office within two weeks of each request.
- At the end of each semester an unofficial transcript for each concurrently enrolled student for financial aid reporting purposes.

Home School Responsibilities:

For each term, this point of contact at the Home school will report term registration data from the Host school to the Home school's Registrar's Office. The Registrar's Office will enter placeholder units in the Home school's information system to record the Host school course enrollment. These placeholder units will allow the Home school's Financial Aid Office to process and disburse all Home school aid based on students' combined enrollment at both schools. The Home school is responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office every time these students drop or withdraw from any Host school courses. Host School enrollment changes must be reported to the Registrar's within one week of notification from the Host school. The point of contact at the Home school is responsible for ensuring all placeholder units reflect accurate enrollment at the Host school.
