3-N-1 Trinity Services adheres to the highest standards of ethical conduct regarding clients, co-workers, students and volunteers. We are dedicated to the self-growth, support, and empowerment of all clients. Therefore we require any volunteers and staff who will have direct contact with clients to complete a 20+ hour training program. Training is held twice a year and is usually completed over a two month time frame.

### **Steps to becoming a volunteer:**

- Fill out a volunteer application and a confidentiality statement and consent to a background check.
- Schedule a personal interview with the Director.
- The Director will check your references, conduct a background check, and schedule you for training.

### **Types of Volunteer Job Assignments**

- Peer Counselors are special friends to participants in our program. They maintain contact, by phone and in person, while the client is in our program.
- Children’s Services volunteers provide constructive supervision during program hours. Mentors help with homework, play games and provide a caring ear. Afternoon programs, evening support groups and weekend activities will fit almost anyone’s schedule.
- Special Services volunteers lend their unique talents to our participants in many ways, including cosmetology, auto maintenance, carpentry, consulting, teaching a craft or performing artistically for participants. This is an area with few limitations!
- Office Assistants provide much needed assistance to office personnel.
- Special Events volunteers assist with special events and fund-raising events.
- Transportation volunteers assist with picking up supplies and materials needed for the program.
- Youth Service Opportunities – teen-age volunteers who serves as teacher’s aides in the classroom.
- Classroom Teachers – in charge of classroom instruction and implementation.
