## ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD RESEARCH IN COOPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, 2022-present

Sturkie Earthworks archaeological site in Upshur County, Texas with recent MA recipient Allen Knous and Mr. John Britt, Chief Archaeologist, United States National Park Service, Natchitoches, LA.
