- <u>Vocabulary lists</u> should be carefully studied with attention to <u>gender and number agreement</u>, verb and subject/object agreement.
- Written accents are essential for accurate writing skills in Spanish. You may use the "Insert Symbol" function in MS Word Latin Extended to add them or by pressing the ALT key on your keyboard and type in the numeric equivalent for the accent using the number pad (set NUM LOC "ON").

► Mac / Apple computers:

- Option E + the vowel $(a, e, i, o, u) = \acute{a}, \acute{e}, \acute{i}, \acute{o}, \acute{u}$
- Option $N = \tilde{n}$
- \Rightarrow View these <u>rules</u> as your friends!
- ⇒ They allow you to pronounce any Spanish word correctly.

Basic rules about <u>accents marks</u> in Spanish:

- o Most words <u>ending in a vowel</u>, or in letters 'n,' or 's' are stressed on the NEXT-TO-LAST (penultimate) syllable. Examples: <u>cla</u>ses, o<u>rigen</u>, <u>hab</u>lan, <u>compro</u>, <u>es</u>ta, <u>es</u>tas.
- Most words ending in any consonant except 'n' or 's' are stressed on the LAST syllable.
 Examples: español, favor, ciudad, arroz, papel.
- When the first two rules above are not followed, <u>a written accent is used</u>. Examples: bal<u>cón</u>, com<u>pró</u>, est<u>ás</u>.
- Written accents are also used to differentiate between words that are pronounced the same but have different meanings. Examples:

$$si = if$$
, $si = yes$ $el = the$, $el = the$ $tu = your$, $tu = you$ $el = this$, $esled = this$ $tu = your$, $tu = you$

- **Important** Words stressed in any other way will carry written accents. Examples: café, ahí, aquí, Félix, música, sílaba.
- Words that ask questions (or that are expressed as exclamations) always carry accents. Examples: ¿Qué? (What?), ¿Cuál? (What? or Which (one)?), ¿Cuáles? (What? or Which (ones)?), ¿Cómo? (How?), ¿Cuándo? (When?), ¿A qué? (At what?), ¿Cuánto/a? (How much?), ¿Cuántos/as? (How many?), ¿Dónde? (Where?), ¿A dónde? (To where?), ¿De dónde? (From where?) ¿Por qué? (Why?), ¡Qué buena idea!
- Words ending in -ión, -ción or -sión, always carry a written accent in a singular form.
 Examples: avión, aviónes, canción, canciónes, sesión, sesiónes.
- o Most verbs in the <u>preterit tense</u> carry accents in the *first* and *third singular person*. Without these accents the verbs would sound like present tense or other tenses. Examples:

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(Yo) compro los libros. (I <u>buy</u> the books.)
José compró los libros (ayer). (José <u>bought</u> the books (yesterday).)
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• When two vowels are together, but do not serve as a diphthong, the weak vowel (i, ú) will carry an accent to distinguish it as a separate syllable. Examples: frío, librería, baúl.

Please note that language learning is a matter of "building blocks;" that is, each new grammar concept builds on constructions that have been previously learned, and vocabulary should be studied and retained throughout the course. Let me know if you are interested in learning more about the Spanish language!

- Zoom: Zoom meetings are online meetings. Zoom meetings are optional in this course, Span 1611.062. We will have <u>four</u> (4) <u>or five</u> (5) Zoom meetings on this course, Span 1611.062. Once you join the meeting, greet and introduce yourself in Spanish and <u>before you leave</u> the meeting, remember to use a farewell <u>and</u> 'goodbye' expressions in Spanish. *Once you participate in the meeting, you can leave the meeting or stay connected until the end of the meeting.
 - * **Zoom** can be also used to set up an appointment where I can meet with you one-on-one discuss the class material or answer any other questions about Span 1611.062.

<u>Note</u>: If you can't meet during the time set up on the **Zoom meetings**, please set up a different day/time in the same week as the Zoom meeting is scheduled. *Remember to let me know at least 48 hours ahead of time*.

- **Tutorials**: These meetings are short meetings and will last from 10-20 minutes a week.
- * Tutorial meetings are short meetings to review the class material and/or discuss questions related to vocabulary, grammar, culture, among other topics of the Spanish language. Please **check your email** and/or on **Announcements** the day/time selected.

<u>Note</u>: These meetings are optional. Let me know if you would like to set up a **Tutorial meeting** on a different day/time than a Tutorial is scheduled. *Remember to let me know 48 hours or more ahead of time*.

• Quizzes: Quizzes will be in a fill-in-the-blank format, matches, questions, and translation. Quizzes will be after each chapter (one per week) of the vText, *Panorama* 6th edition. Quizzes will be completed on VHL Central site and will be related to the material learned on Modules/Canvas, videos and discussion boards and the VHL Central activities. Students will have <u>one attempt</u> to complete <u>each</u> Quiz. Students are to complete each quiz in one sitting.

<u>Note</u>: **Before** you take a **Quiz**, please **read** the instructions **carefully**, due dates, # of attempts and questions, total points and **study the material** per Lesson/Module.

- *Grammar-Quizzes: Do not forget to write exclamation, question and accent marks, if necessary.
- Exams: We will have 4 Midterm-Exams that will include 15 lessons during the term (Fall 2023). Exams will be taken on VHL Central. Students will have one attempt to complete each exam. Students are to complete each exam in one sitting. Each exam will include similar material provided on the Quizzes. I recommend you review the material learned on the Modules (discussion boards), vText: Panorama and the quizzes taken before you take an Exam.

<u>Note</u>: Before you take each Midterm-Exam, you have to complete all the homework and quizzes on VHL Central & discussion boards on Canvas. Then, you will have to request a passcode that I will provide. The material included on each Midterm-exams is related to the activities completed on Modules/Chapters and VHL Central. The information about each Midterm-Exam (e.g. due dates) is provided in the class syllabus.

*Grammary-Exams: Do not forget to write exclamation, question and accent marks, if necessary.

<u>Note</u>: Students are responsible for <u>any</u> technical issue that may arise before and/or during taking a test on <u>VHL Center and/or Canvas</u>. <u>Technical issue will not grant a re-take</u>.

 This is a required exam that will cover the material for Beginning Spanish or equivalent. Grade Replacement/Forgiveness and Census Date Policies: Students repeating a course for grade forgiveness (grade replacement) must file a Grade Replacement Contract with the Enrollment Services Center (ADM 230) on or before the Census Date of the semester in which the course will be repeated. Grade Replacement Contracts are available in the Enrollment Services Center or at http://www.uttyler.edu/registrar. Each semester's Census Date can be found on the Contract itself, on the Academic Calendar, or in the information pamphlets published each semester by the Office of the Registrar. Failure to file a Grade Replacement Contract will result in both the original and repeated grade being used to calculate your overall grade point average. Undergraduates are eligible to exercise grade replacement for only three course repeats during their career at UT Tyler; graduates are eligible for two grade replacements. Full policy details are printed on each Grade Replacement Contract.

The Census Date is the deadline for many forms and enrollment actions that students need to be aware of. These include:

- Submitting Grade Replacement Contracts, Transient Forms, requests to withhold directory information, approvals for taking courses as Audit. Pass/Fail or Credit/No Credit.
- Receiving 100% refunds for partial withdrawals. (There is no refund for these after the Census Date)
- Schedule adjustments (section changes, adding a new class, dropping without a "W" grade).
- Being reinstated or re-enrolled in classes after being dropped for non-payment.
- Completing the process for tuition exemptions or waivers through Financial Aid.

State-Mandated Course Drop Policy: Texas law prohibits a student who began college for the first time in Fall 2007 or thereafter from dropping more than six courses during their entire undergraduate career. This includes courses dropped at another 2-year or 4-year Texas public college or university. For purposes of this rule, a dropped course is any course that is dropped after the census date (See Academic Calendar for the specific date).

Exceptions to the 6-drop rule may be found in the catalog. Petitions for exemptions must be submitted to the Enrollment Services Center and must be accompanied by documentation of the extenuating circumstance. Please contact the Enrollment Services Center if you have any questions.
