#### Methodology

The UT-Tyler Poll is a statewide random sample of 1,032 registered voters conducted September 18 and 24, 2025. The mixed-mode sample includes 301 registered voters surveyed over the phone by the University of Texas at Tyler with support from ProMark Research and 731 registered voters randomly selected from Dynata's panel of online respondents. The weighted margin of error for the sample of 1,032 registered voters in Texas is +/- 3.4 percentage points for a 95% confidence interval.

The online and phone surveys were conducted in English and Spanish. Using information from the 2024 Current Population Survey and Office of the Texas Secretary of State. The sample's gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, metropolitan density and vote choice closely match the population of registered voters in Texas.

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
