# **Demographic Profile**

The population in Gregg County, Texas was 124,245 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 59,030 with a participation rate of 61.7%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Gregg County, Texas, 21.8% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in Gregg County, Texas is \$63,811 and the median house value is \$171,900.



# **Unemployment Rate**


The unemployment rate for Gregg County, Texas was 5.0% as of February 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.2%. One year earlier, in February 2023, the unemployment rate in Gregg County, Texas was 4.8%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through February 2024.

# **Wage Trends**

The average worker in Gregg County, Texas earned annual wages of \$55,839 as of 2023Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 6.1% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$69,861 in the nation as of 2023Q4.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2023Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4.

# **Cost of Living Index**

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 4.8% lower in Gregg County, Texas than the U.S. average.

## **Occupation Snapshot**

The largest major occupation group in Gregg County, Texas is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 10,075 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (7,849 workers) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (7,744). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (LQ = 1.71), Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.36), and Production Occupations (1.19).

Occupation groups in Gregg County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$113,800), Management Occupations (\$110,900), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$101,800). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.2% among Legal Occupations to 7.7% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Gregg County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.3% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+45 jobs) and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+41). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,309 jobs) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (1,112).



Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2023Q3, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4. Wages by occupation are as of 2023 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth

# **Industry Clusters**

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Gregg County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Coal/Oil/Power with a location quotient of 6.91. This cluster employs 4,568 workers in the region with an average wage of \$103,099. Employment in the Coal/Oil/Power cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.1% per year over the next ten years.

# Industry Clusters for Gregg County, Texas as of 2023Q4



### **Education Levels**

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Gregg County, Texas is projected to grow 0.1% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.4% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.4% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.4% per year.


# Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels

### **Gross Domestic Product**

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2022, nominal GDP in Gregg County, Texas expanded 16.5%. This follows growth of 10.9% in 2021. As of 2022, total GDP in Gregg County, Texas was \$9,547,284,000.



Of the sectors in Gregg County, Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2022, \$1,220,294,000 The next-largest contributions came from Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$1,092,753,000); Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$1,010,182,000); and Health Care and Social Assistance (\$961,481,000).
