Economic Overview 2024

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Demographic Profile

The population in the Texarkana Area was 187,686 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022. The region has a civilian labor force of 78,792 with a participation rate of 52.8%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Texarkana Area, 18.0% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.8% in the nation. The median household income in the Texarkana Area is \$53,116 and the median house value is \$135,330.

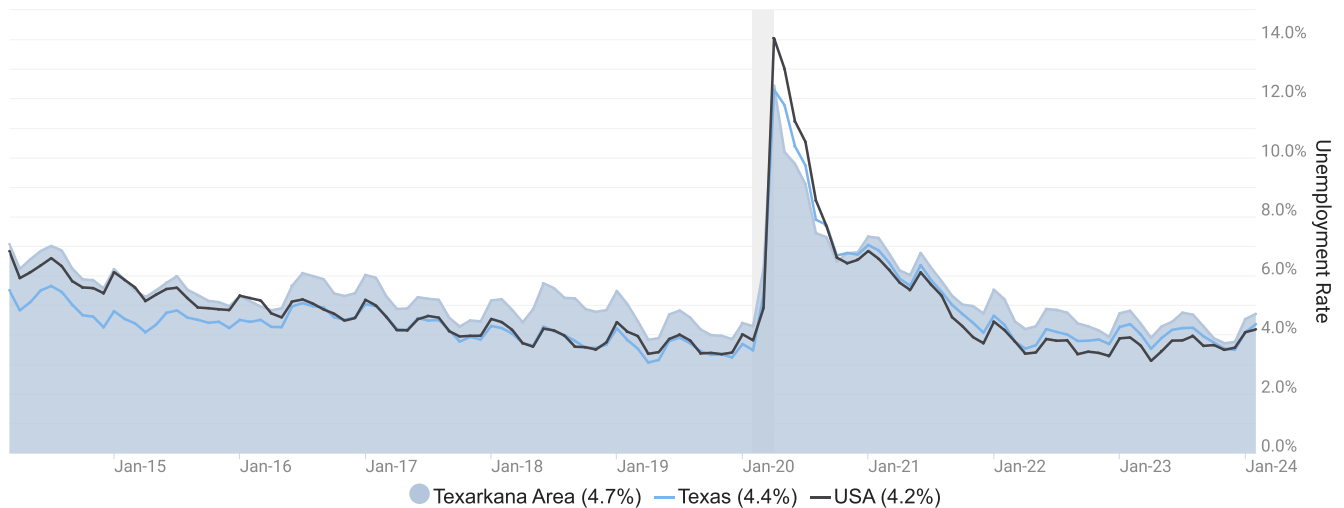
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Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for the Texarkana Area was 4.7% as of February 2024. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.2%. One year earlier, in February 2023, the unemployment rate in the Texarkana Area was 4.8%.

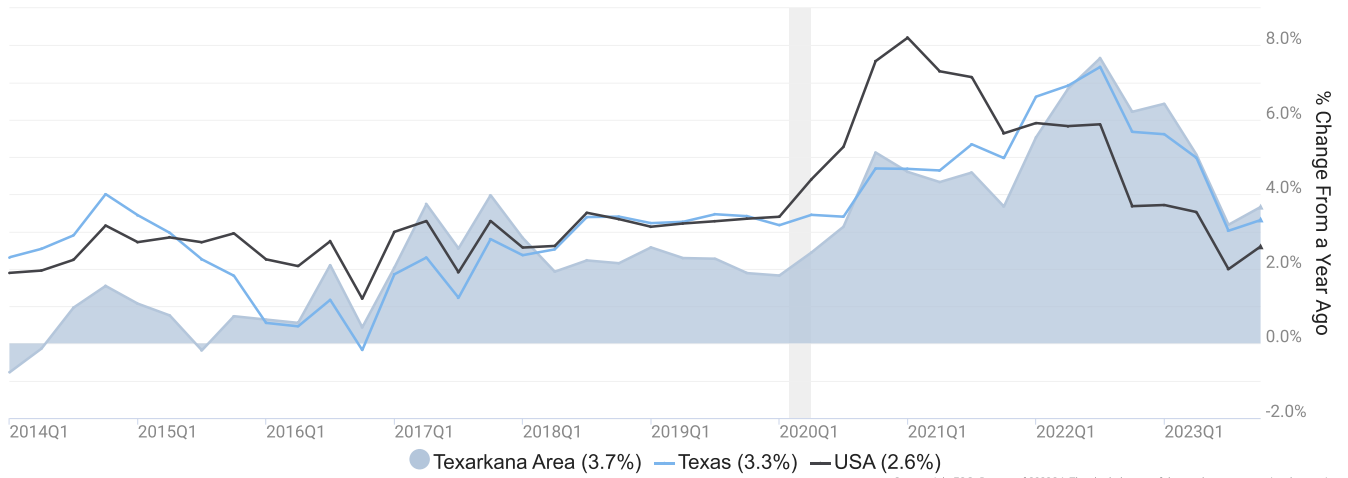
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Wage Trends

The average worker in the Texarkana Area earned annual wages of \$47,727 as of 2023Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 3.7% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$69,861 in the nation as of 2023Q4.

Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2023Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q4.

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Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 11.6% lower in Texarkana Area than the U.S. average.

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Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Texarkana Area is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 8,183 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (6,828 workers) and Sales and Related Occupations (6,692). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (LQ = 1.27), Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.25), and Production Occupations (1.23).

Occupation groups in the Texarkana Area with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$96,800), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$88,200), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$88,000). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.2% among Legal Occupations to 6.5% among Transportation and Material Moving Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Texarkana Area is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+48 jobs) and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+20). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,287 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (895).

Wages by occupation are as of 2023 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

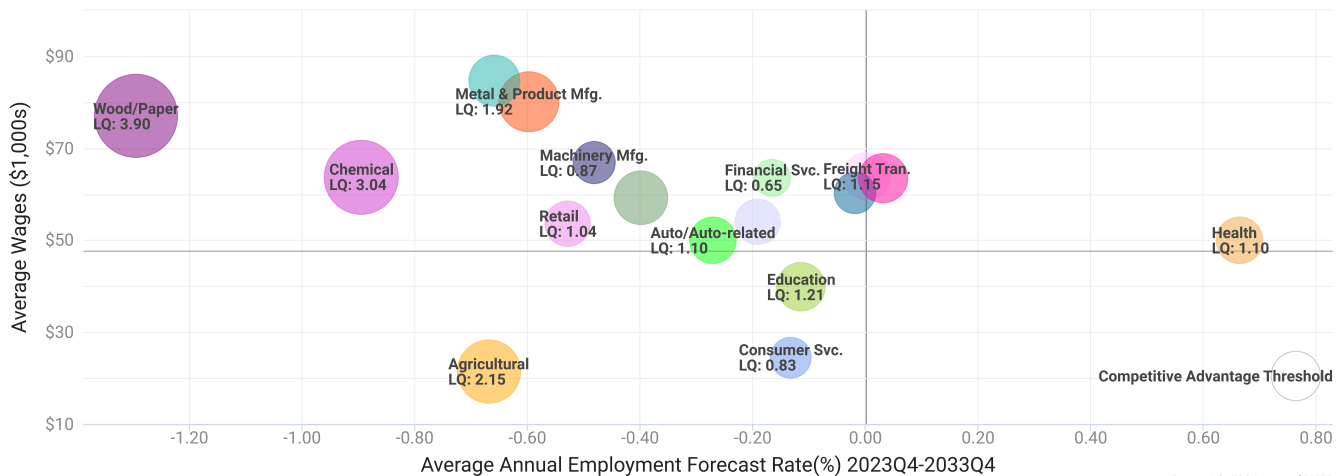
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Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Texarkana Area with the highest relative concentration is Wood/Paper with a location quotient of 3.90. This cluster employs 2,208 workers in the region with an average wage of \$77,015. Employment in the Wood/Paper cluster is projected to contract in the region about 1.3% per year over the next ten years.

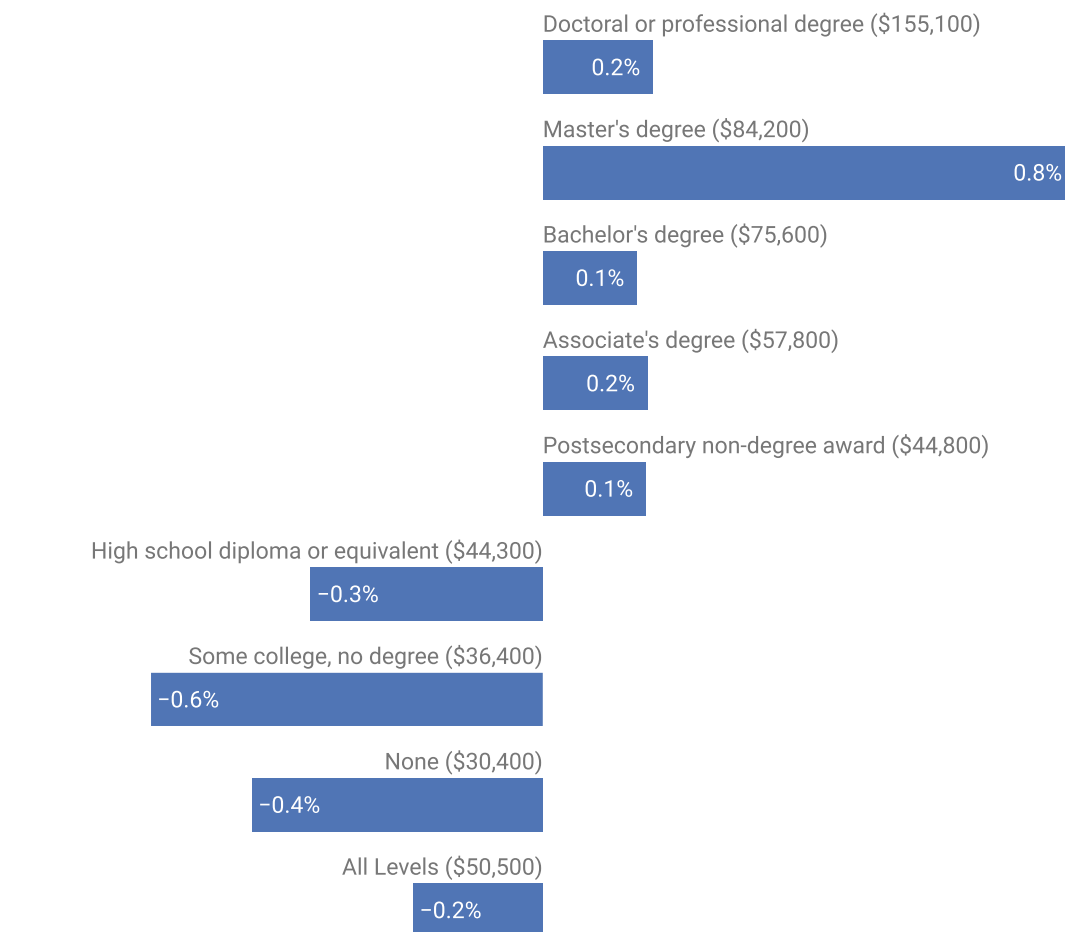
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Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Texarkana Area is projected to contract 0.2% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.2% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.1% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.2% per year.

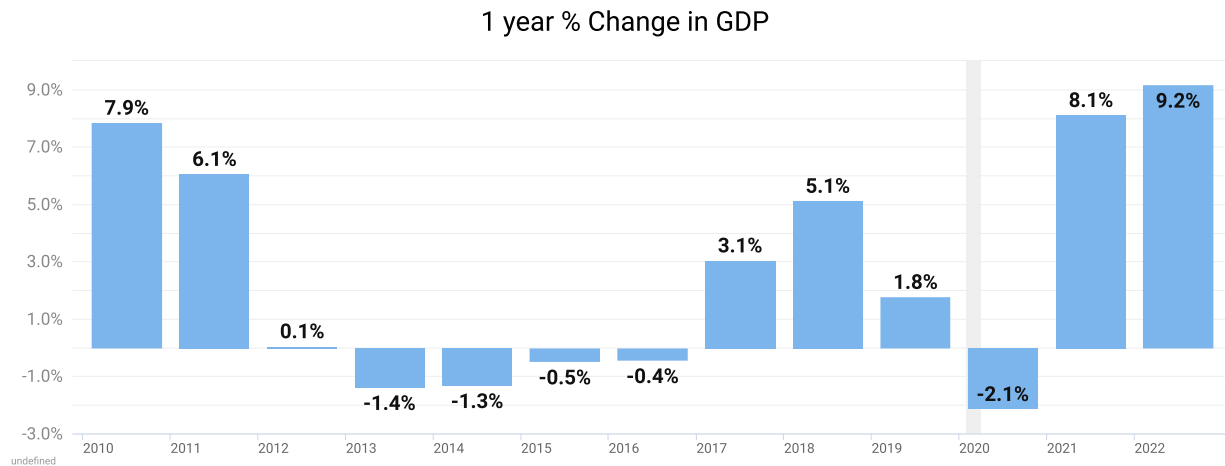

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Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2022, nominal GDP in the Texarkana Area expanded 9.2%. This follows growth of 8.1% in 2021. As of 2022, total GDP in the Texarkana Area was \$7,696,245,000.

Of the sectors in the Texarkana Area, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2022, \$1,441,408,000. The next-largest contributions came from Health Care and Social Assistance (\$830,611,000); Retail Trade (\$677,415,000); and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$641,518,000).
