### Camp County Economic Overview 2026

## Demographic Profile

The population in Camp County, Texas was 12,652 per American Community Survey data for 2019-2023. The region has a civilian labor force of 5,473 with a participation rate of 56.5%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Camp County, Texas, 17.4% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 36.5% in the nation. The median household income in Camp County, Texas is \$55,061 and the median house value is \$159,900.



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## Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for Camp County, Texas was 4.6% as of September 2025. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.3%. One year earlier, in September 2024, the unemployment rate in Camp County, Texas was 4.6%.





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## Wage Trends

The average worker in Camp County, Texas earned annual wages of \$48,773 as of 2025Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.0% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$75,686 in the nation as of 2025Q2.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2025Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2025Q2.

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## Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 10.2% lower in Camp County, Texas than the U.S. average.

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## Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Camp County, Texas is Management Occupations, employing 634 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (399 workers) and Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (376). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 14.81), Management Occupations (1.83), and Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (1.33).

Occupation groups in Camp County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$94,600), Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$93,100), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$87,200). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.5% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 9.2% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Camp County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.8% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Management Occupations (+5 jobs) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (+4). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (64 jobs) and Management Occupations (59).


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## Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Camp County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Agricultural with a location quotient of 30.09. This cluster employs 894 workers in the region with an average wage of \$49,823. Employment in the Agricultural cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.4% per year over the next ten years.


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## Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Camp County, Texas is projected to grow 0.8% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.2% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.0% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.9% per year.



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## Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2024, nominal GDP in Camp County, Texas contracted 14.5%. This follows growth of 11.0% in 2023. As of 2024, total GDP in Camp County, Texas was \$525,156,000.

Of the sectors in Camp County, Texas, Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2024, \$133,005,000. The next-largest contributions came from Wholesale Trade (\$63,795,000); Utilities (\$55,121,000); and Construction (\$35,616,000).
