## Demographic Profile

The population in Marion County, Texas was 9,631 per American Community Survey data for 2019-2023. The region has a civilian labor force of 3,972 with a participation rate of 49.2%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Marion County, Texas, 16.3% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 36.5% in the nation. The median household income in Marion County, Texas is \$47,447 and the median house value is \$110,500.



## Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for Marion County, Texas was 6.3% as of September 2025. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.3%. One year earlier, in September 2024, the unemployment rate in Marion County, Texas was 5.9%.





## Wage Trends

The average worker in Marion County, Texas earned annual wages of \$43,263 as of 2025Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 9.0% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$75,686 in the nation as of 2025Q2.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2025Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2025Q2.

## Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 10.6% lower in Marion County, Texas than the U.S. average.

## Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Marion County, Texas is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 276 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Production Occupations (271 workers) and Management Occupations (254). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 1.92), Healthcare Support Occupations (1.89), and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1.27).

Occupation groups in Marion County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$88,800), Management Occupations (\$86,500), and Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$84,800). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 2.5% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 10.4% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Marion County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Support Occupations (+3 jobs) and Construction and Extraction Occupations (+1). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (50 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (34).



## Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Marion County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Wood/Paper with a location quotient of 15.82. This cluster employs 301 workers in the region with an average wage of \$75,453. Employment in the Wood/Paper cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.5% per year over the next ten years.



## Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Marion County, Texas is projected to grow 0.1% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.6% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.2% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.4% per year.



## Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2024, nominal GDP in Marion County, Texas expanded 2.2%. This follows growth of 6.3% in 2023. As of 2024, total GDP in Marion County, Texas was \$263,155,000.

Of the sectors in Marion County, Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2024, \$56,309,000. The next-largest contributions came from Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$28,909,000); Health Care and Social Assistance (\$23,214,000); and Utilities (\$22,931,000).


