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Tyler Area Economic Overview 2026

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Demographic Profile

The population in the Tyler Area was 757,394 per American Community Survey data for 2019-2023. The region has a civilian labor force of 340,813 with a participation rate of 56.8%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Tyler Area, 21.2% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 36.5% in the nation. The median household income in the Tyler Area is \$66,341 and the median house value is \$193,666.

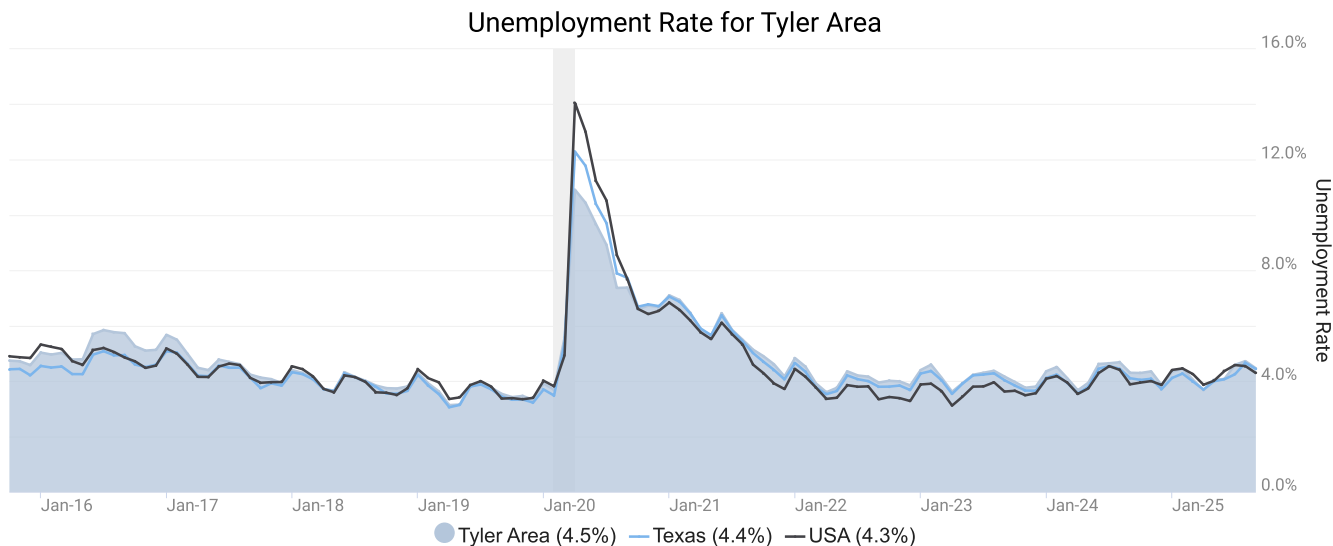

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Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for the Tyler Area was 4.5% as of September 2025. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.3%. One year earlier, in September 2024, the unemployment rate in the Tyler Area was 4.3%.



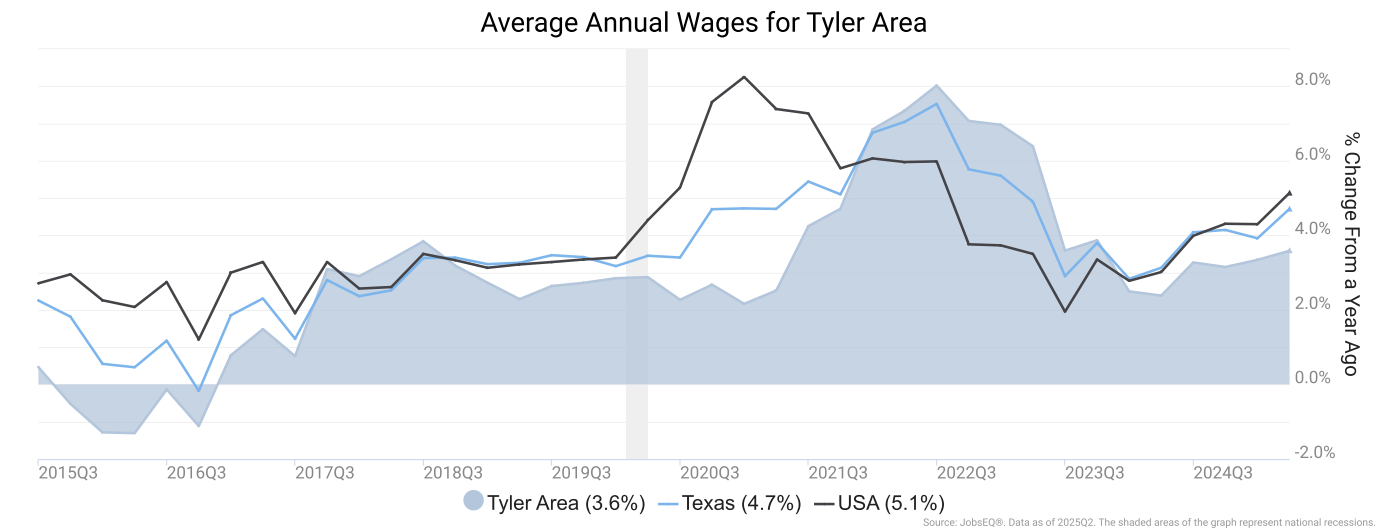

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Wage Trends

The average worker in the Tyler Area earned annual wages of \$54,682 as of 2025Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 3.6% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$75,686 in the nation as of 2025Q2.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2025Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2025Q2.

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Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 7.8% lower in Tyler Area than the U.S. average.

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Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Tyler Area is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 34,308 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Management Occupations (29,952 workers) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (29,262). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (LQ = 1.35), Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.20), and Management Occupations (1.18).

Occupation groups in the Tyler Area with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$109,100), Legal Occupations (\$99,200), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$94,400). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.5% among Legal Occupations to 8.0% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Tyler Area is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Management Occupations (+272 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+262). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (5,419 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (3,799).

Wages by occupation are as of 2025 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

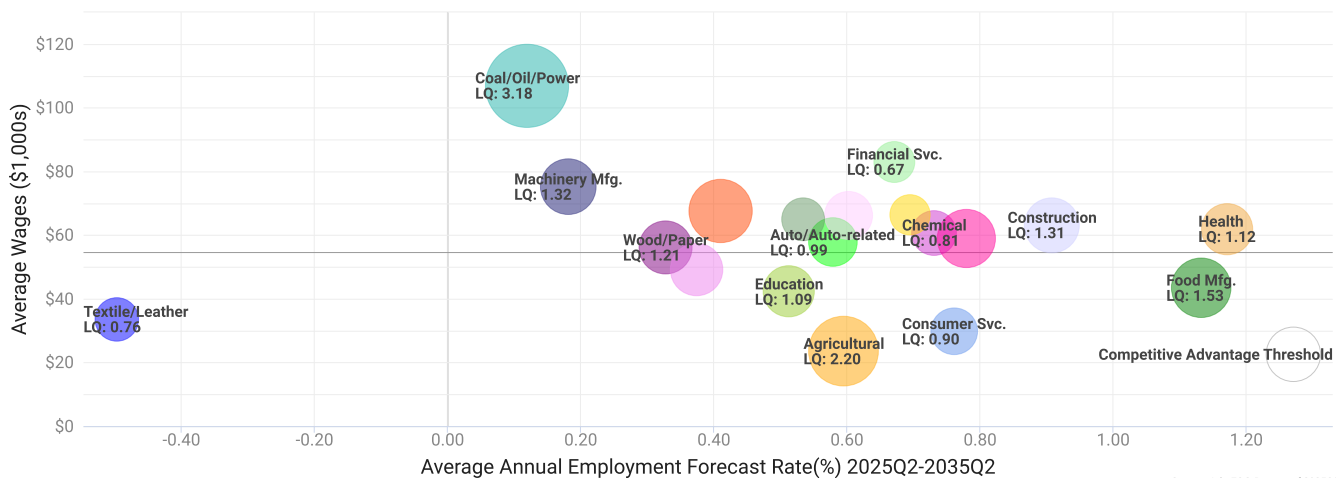
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Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Tyler Area with the highest relative concentration is Coal/Oil/Power with a location quotient of 3.18. This cluster employs 8,359 workers in the region with an average wage of \$106,895. Employment in the Coal/Oil/Power cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.1% per year over the next ten years.

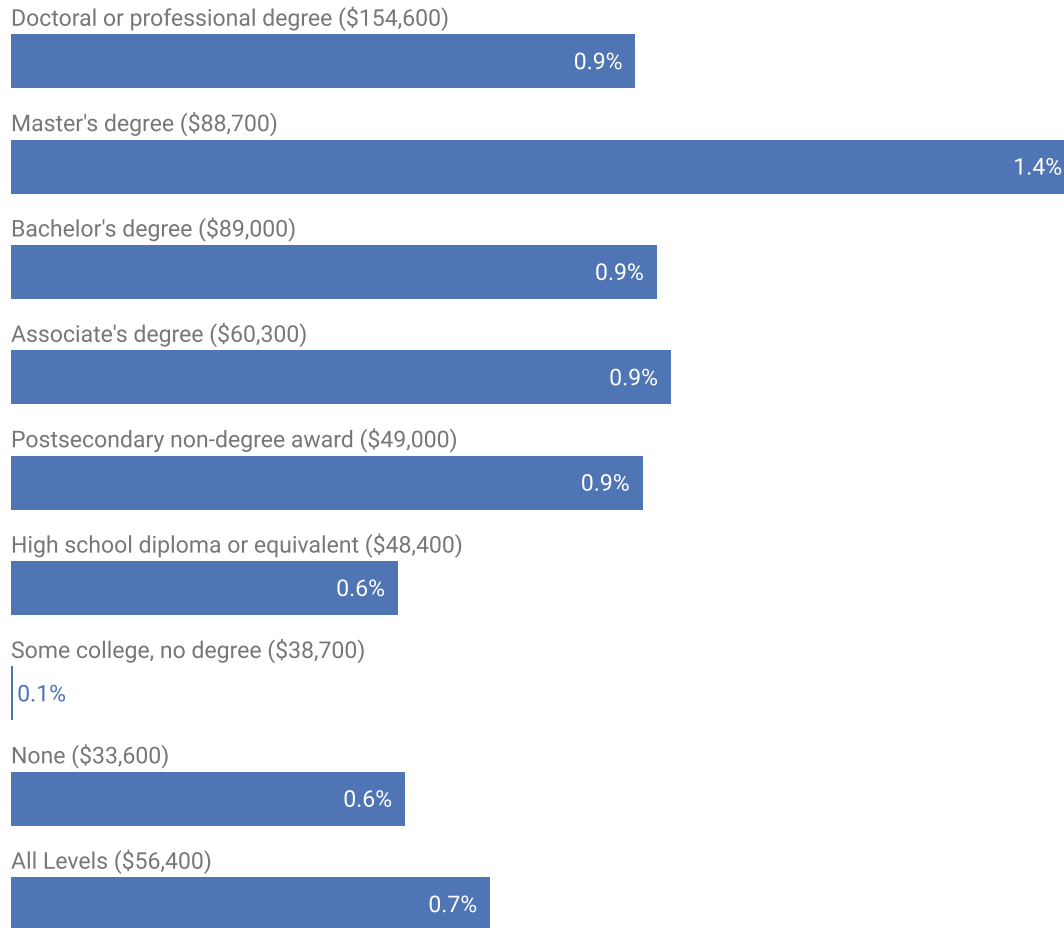
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Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Tyler Area is projected to grow 0.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.9% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.9% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.9% per year.

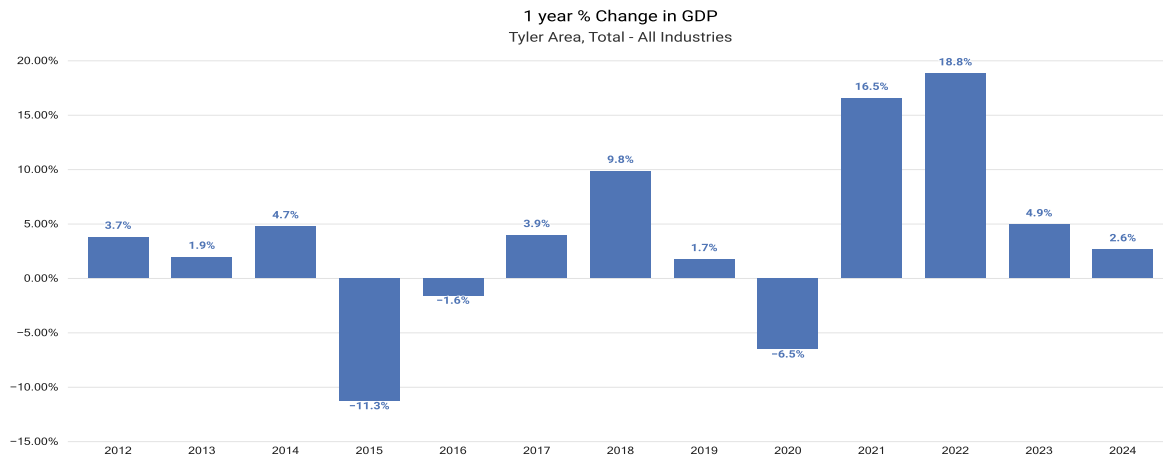

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Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2024, nominal GDP in the Tyler Area expanded 2.6%. This follows growth of 4.9% in 2023. As of 2024, total GDP in the Tyler Area was \$42,191,338,000.

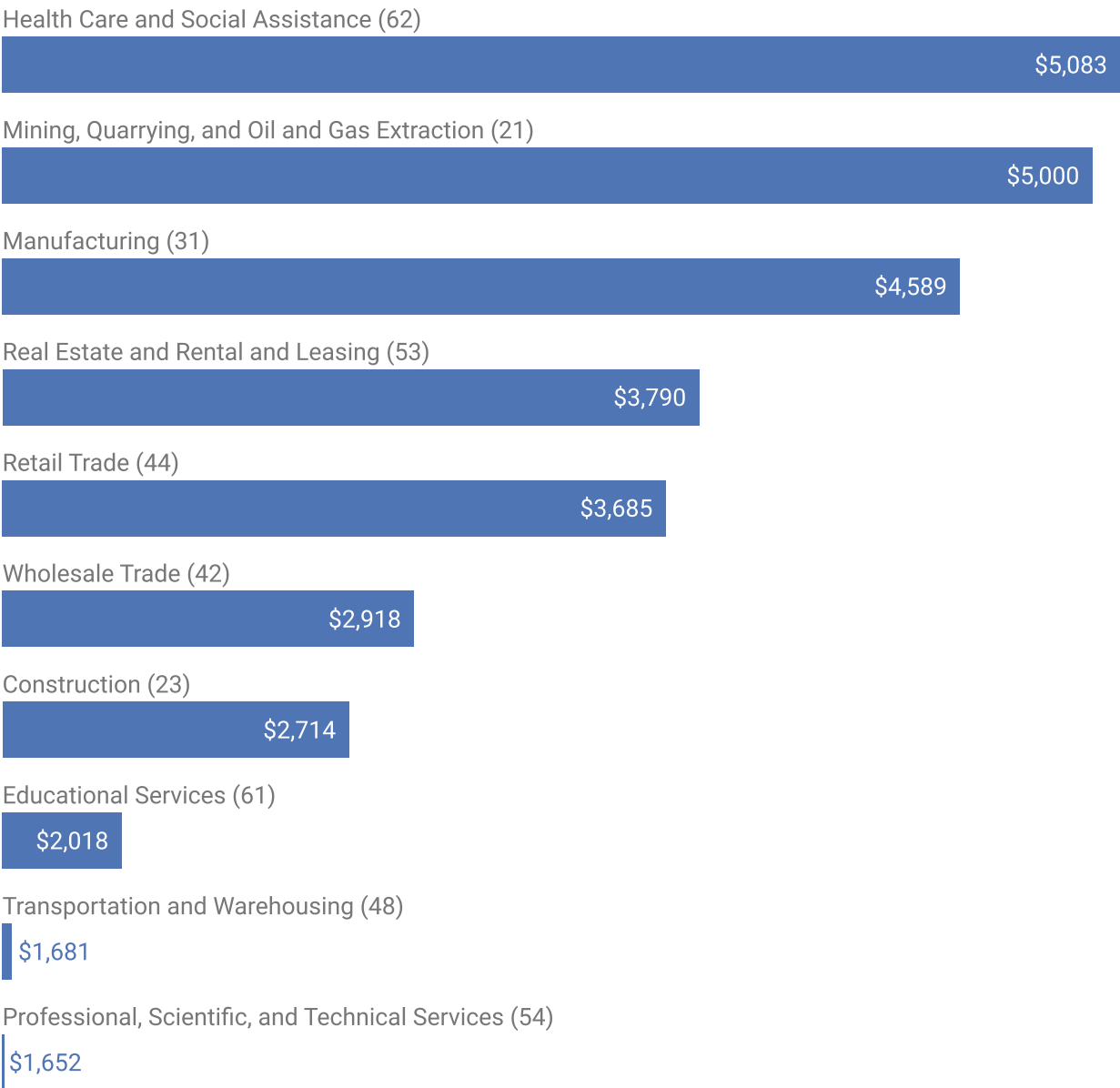
Of the sectors in the Tyler Area, Health Care and Social Assistance contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2024, \$5,083,346,000. The next-largest contributions came from Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$5,000,368,000); Manufacturing (\$4,589,240,000); and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$3,790,401,000).
