Course Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to fulfill the requirements as agreed between instructor and student and get prepared to successfully pass a prelim exam in Fall 2025.

Course Competencies:

A letter grade will be granted if all the following requirements are met with more than 90 points total:

- A one-page proposal on the semester plan (10pts)
- Progress in September, October, and November (30pts x3) submit a double-spaced dissertation chapter, correctly following the APA formatting guidelines, to show progress in the month

Course Requirements:

The student is expected to write all chapters that demonstrate her knowledge in research and writing skills required as a doctoral student, which will be gained in this independent study.

Grading Policy for HRD 6399

A letter grade, either A (Satisfactory Completion with Confidence), if she meets all requirements (see above) will be granted.

Work Progress

This course is based on a step-by-step process throughout the semester. Only if the student does meet the requirements in each step of a research process as listed in Core Competencies, can she move forward to take a prelim exam in Fall 2025. There will be no "incomplete" granted.

Writing Expectations

The student will work through the development of her academic writing skills required as a doctoral student, using the APA formatting guidelines. The student will learn how to organize ideas in a pointed way, demonstrate critical thinking skills, and aptly cite sources and references based on APA 7th (2020) guidelines.

Zoom Meetings

The instructor and student will have meetings via Zoom, on a need basis, to have discussions about the quality of chapters and to check if student learning is progressing as scheduled.
