Program (CEP) - Clinical Mental Health Counseling - MA

Program Mission Statement: The Master of Arts in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program is intended to prepare students to counsel persons experiencing emotional distress through development of specific competencies in assessment, counseling/therapy theories and methods, counseling/therapy practice, and ethical counseling practices. Students who complete their programs and get their degrees are well prepared for the Licensed Professional Counselor state licensing examination and are employed in a variety of mental health settings. Students may complete a generalist program or specialize in marriage and family counseling. Students specializing in marriage and family counseling acquire additional competencies in marriage and family counseling interventions. The core program curriculum is designed to align with national Clinical Mental Health Counseling standards of the Council on the Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP).

Report Organization Explanation: The assessment plan for this program was thoroughly revised at the beginning of the 2008-2009 academic year. Eleven SLOs, based on national standards, replaced four SLOs that were the basis for assessments in 2007-2008. The 11 current SLOs are placed at the beginning of the report and are followed by the four SLOs that were discontinued at the beginning of 2008-2009.
