University of Texas at Tyler Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program Outcomes and Annual Report 2022

Selected Program Updates:

- CMHC Program's CSI UTT Chapter hosted its first annual practicum and internship fair, hosting supervisors from 15 different sites on campus
- CMHC Program has ceased using the on-campus training clinic for practicum hours due to challenges with client flow. All CMHC students now complete their Practicum and Internship hours at community-based sites with required audio-recorded sessions.
- Course prerequisites went into effect to ensure students are progressing through CMHC program appropriately to prepare for practicum and internship.
- CMHC program faculty reviewed the largest number of applications in program history for the Fall 2022 semester and offered admission to 22 students.
- An all-time high of 86.2% of our CMHC courses are now taught by core CMHC faculty instead of adjuncts or faculty from other programs.
- CACREP re-accreditation self-study was submitted in July 2022.

CMHC Program Objectives

Key Performance Indicators

8.a. Students will utilize research skills to critically assess counseling research and client care

9.a. Students will determine and implement ethical clinical skills to address client mental health concerns across a variety of clinical mental health settings
