Course Description:

The course is designed to introduce pre-service intermediate and secondary teachers to effective planning, implementing and evaluating elements of instruction. The course also provides a field component.

Module 1: Philosophical Foundations of Curriculum. January 16-February 4, 2024. Essay due February 4, 11:00 pm.

The four current philosophies of education will be discussed: Essentialism, Perennialism (Classical Humanism), Progressivism, and Romanticism and their application to intermediate and secondary school curriculum. You will learn how each philosophy addresses the following elements of teaching.

How is knowledge taught?

How are skills taught to process information?

How are values and beliefs presented in public education?

What types of assessments are used in each philosophy?

Module 2: Adolescents: A Time of Change and Transition. February 5-18, 2024.

The following four areas of development will be presented:

- 1.Physical Development
- 2. Social Development
- 3. Emotional Development
- 4. Intellectual Development

Module 3: 6-12 Curriculum Content and the Texas TEKS February 19-25, 2024.

The Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) in the 6-12 curriculum will be introduced as a prelude to Module 4: Lesson Planning. For the initial introduction, students will be exposed to all disciplines. After this module, students will create lessons, activities, and a unit based on their own discipline.

Module 4: Lesson Planning: Cognitive Domain February 26- March 10, 2024. Lesson Plan #1 due March 10, 11:00 pm.

Lesson plan #2 due March 24, 11:00 pm.

Two types of lesson plans will be introduced: Teacher Directed and 5-E Lesson plan. Six cognitive levels of thinking, Bloom's Taxonomy will be introduced. Memory (remember), Comprehension (understand), Apply, Analysis, Evaluate, and Create. Student will be able to distinguish objectives from activities.
