“Erasing the “C” from CHF (Congestive Heart Failure): From Congestion to Compensation and Cardiac Recovery”

Objectives: At the end of this presentation, participants should have increased information to differentiate between the different classifications and pathophysiologic stages of heart failure using hemodynamic, structural, and functional criteria, assess the volume status of decompensated heart failure patients by synthesizing clinical findings, imaging results, and relevant biomarkers, evaluate novel pharmacologic strategies and device therapies for acute heart failure exacerbation, emphasizing on rapid, complete hemodynamic stabilization and a new interpretation of cardiorenal syndrome and design multidisciplinary care pathways within the institutional framework that support early identification, longitudinal monitoring, and durable recovery in patients transitioning from congestive to compensated heart failure.
