Grading Scale:

Specific guidelines and grading criteria for all assignments are in the Modules. Final grades for the course will be determined based upon the following point assignments:

A - 90-100

Grades will not be rounded when calculating the average (79.5 is not rounded to 80, and 89.5 is not rounded to 90). The simple average of all exam grades must be at or above 80% to pass the course. Once the student has achieved a simple unit exam average of 80% or higher, course grades will be determined based on the weighted calculation of exams and other required course work. If the exam average is below 80% the overall course grade will be reduced by one letter grade. SOAP notes must also meet the 80% average threshold to pass the course. Students are required to achieve an average of 80% (B) to complete the course successfully.

Clinical Course Requirements Information:

1) Clinical Objectives

Students should have a minimum three (3) written and measurable clinical objectives focusing on chronic disease management for the clinical site, which should be given to the preceptor before starting clinical hours. These Clinical Objectives are uploaded into the Canvas assignment link. Multiple submissions via the assignment link are permitted.

The clinical objectives should be measurable, realistic, and based on the clinical environment and the CPE criteria for this course as well as the course content and/or course module objectives. The student's individual learning needs are considered for these objectives.

A Clinical Objective example: During this course, I will complete ten Cardiovascular cases to include any of the following: HTN, HLD, CHF, Afib, CAD, PAD/PVD encounters with 80% accuracy.

2) Clinical Hours Required

NURS 5455 is a 4-hour didactic course with 145 clinical hours, 14-week course. Students can expect a minimum of 12 hours of clinical per week to complete the required clinical hours.

A minimum of 145-clinical hours are required for satisfactory completion of this course and a total of 675 clinical hours is required for the entire program.

The breakdown of clinical hours for the entire NP program is as follows:

• Pediatrics – 120 hours total

- Women's Health 75 hours total
- Family Practice 480 hours total

Ideally, clinical hours are recommended to be completed with an Advanced Practice Nurse. Clinical hours may also be completed with a physician (MD or DO) or physician's assistant (PA). To meet the course learning objectives, a student may choose to work with physicians, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners in a setting that meets the educational needs for the semester. Please remember that students are not allowed to rotate with their supervisor or anyone in their direct line of report or with a relative. Students currently employed at smaller facilities such as physician- or NP-owned clinics will likely need to rotate elsewhere. Each course has a specific population focus for clinicals, and clinical sites/preceptors must be approved by the clinical instructor.

You must begin to have Hands-on, Direct patient encounter experiences by the second clinical week, or within 16-hours of clinical. If your clinical site is not able to offer this direct experience to you, please notify your faculty as soon as possible. The last possible clinical day is at the end of week 13.

Approximately one-half of the total 145-clinical hours for this course should be focused on chronic disease management, when possible. Please attempt to predominantly focus your opportunities on the Adult/Geriatric population in addition to chronic disease management. Use *InPlace* age ranges to guide your age designations: geriatric (age 50 or older), Adults 26 and older, Adolescents up to age 25. These hours may be achieved within a mixture of environments: Family Practice, Internal Medicine, Adult Health, Geriatric Health Clinic, or Long-Term Care/ Skilled Nursing/ Rehabilitation, Assisted Living facilities or Home Care.

3) Appropriate Clinical Attire

A lab coat with the UT Tyler School of Nursing patch on the left chest and ID badge are while in the clinical area. All clothing should be clean, pressed, with no frayed hems showing. Men are to wear button up shirts that are tucked in and a belt. Ties are optional. Ladies are to wear professional dresses or pants and shirts that do not show cleavage. Running shoes and jeans are considered unacceptable and may result in dismissal from the clinic for the day. Should a preceptor advise the student to wear scrubs then this is permitted only in that preceptor's setting. Scrubs are not the normal attire of NPs in clinics. Students should ask their preceptor how they should dress prior to arrival at the clinical site. Remember, UT Tyler NP students are representing themselves and the university as future NP's and need to look the part.

4) Preceptor Handbooks

Students are required to give each preceptor a UT Tyler Preceptor Handbook and review the contents of the handbook with them. The Preceptor Handbook is available on Mission Possible in Canvas. In addition, students are expected to develop specific clinical objectives and provide them to each of their preceptors at the beginning of their clinical rotations.

5) Clinical Hours Documented within the Clinical Platform: *InPlace*Clinical hours data should be entered into *InPlace*, each night within 72 hours of the clinical date.
Clinical time should not be used to enter data into *InPlace*. The *InPlace* hours and preceptor signature page sheet hours must match.

Students are to use the clinical time to see patients as quickly and efficiently as possible. Do not count lunch into the hours entered into *InPlace,* if a break was taken for lunch. If the student ate while charting, then this time will count as clinical hours.

Confidentiality - maintain patient confidentiality by not removing any patient identifiers from clinics other than patient initials for the *InPlace* log as this would be considered a HIPPA violation. Students may not take a printed patient schedule, lab, or any other printed information from the clinic setting. No screenshots or copies of any patient records are allowed.

6) Preceptor Verification of Signature Pages

Preceptor signatures should be obtained each day the student is in clinical. Please use the preceptor signature sheet located within Canvas. Students will need to verify their *InPlace* submissions by showing they correlate with their preceptor signature sheets. The student must add up the time on their preceptor signature sheet and tabulate the "time with patient" on their *InPlace* entries (excluding lunch) and these hours must correlate.

7) Clinical Performance Evaluations

Students must obtain a passing clinical performance evaluation (CPE) by the student's faculty member before a grade in the course will be determined. For this course, the student is expected to make an appropriate plan of care for every patient seen in clinical. Students must also meet the satisfactory level of 80% on CPE and/or Observed Structured Clinical Evaluation (OSCE).

Please see the Clinical Performance Evaluation (CPE) for specific areas evaluated. Students will be evaluated by their clinical faculty member using several means including, but not necessarily limited to, the following: observation, chart review, speed of patients seen, discussions with the student's preceptor(s), and review of feedback provided by the preceptor CPEs. Clinical performance requires application of key concepts in providing care to individuals and families as evidenced by documentation in the CPE. **TWO CPE's** are required for this course — **one mid-term and one final evaluation**. Students must satisfactorily complete the clinical performance component of the course to be eligible to pass the course. A minimum of two satisfactory CPE's from the preceptor must be completed to provide evidence of satisfactory performance. Failure to complete the clinical component satisfactorily will result in a course failure.

You will be expected to participate in the **OSCE** for a faculty clinical evaluation. The **OSCE is in lieu of the Faculty CPE.** This is a skills check-off utilizing a standardized patient scenario or modified simulation/pseudo clinic evaluation for Faculty CPE and may be conducted in lieu of the Faculty CPE. The schedule will be posted for attendance of the clinical skills check-off as an individual or within groups during the semester. Do NOT plan on or anticipate scheduling a usual Clinical Day for any dates you have set for either the OSCE or the in-person Faculty CPE. You may not count the hours spent during OSCE but may count hours spent with Faculty for a CPE check-off as part of your Clinical hours and will need to include those hours and cases within *InPlace* for credit as clinical experiences.

Clinical Expectation Scores for CPE performance:

- First clinical course [Level 1]: must be met at the <u>minimum score of 2</u> in order to pass the course. The student should be able to see one patient per hour at the end of the course.
- Second clinical course [Level 2]: must be met at the <u>minimum score of 2.5</u> in order to pass the course. The student should be able to see one-two patients per hour at the end of the course.
- Third clinical course [Level 3]: must be met at the <u>minimum score of a 3</u> in order to pass the course. The student should be able to see two patients per hour at the end of the course.

Note: At the discretion of the faculty additional site visits and/or clinical hours (in 40-hour segments) may be added to the student's overall course requirement if the student does not perform satisfactorily during evaluation by either faculty or preceptor. In addition, faculty may make unannounced visits to the clinical site or call the preceptor at any time to evaluate a student's progress. Please be sure to keep faculty informed of any changes in clinical schedule/times. Should an unsatisfactory CPE/OSCES be documented, a subsequent CPE/OSCE may be needed. The subsequent CPE/OSCES must demonstrate satisfactory performance in order for the student to pass the clinical portion of the course. Please note that there is a course requirement that ALL site visits (and all clinical hours) must be completed by the date on the course calendar. If the student fails their OCSEs or CPE, this may result in course failure.
