The Master of Science in Nursing program is designed to prepare individuals for careers in service, education, primary care, and research. Emphasis is given to developing the advanced practice skills necessary to provide expert nursing care to clients either directly though clinical practice, or indirectly through the avenues of administration, research or education. Utilizing advanced knowledge and critical thinking skills along with foundational caring philosophy and health promotion, the program prepares individuals to meet new challenges and the provision of holistic health care. Essential leadership and management skills are integrated with current theory and research in these areas.

The Master of Science in Nursing program builds on UT Tyler's undergraduate program in nursing and provides a firm basis for doctoral level education.
