7. **Wellness and Prevention:** Promote, maintain and/or restore optimal mental health throughout the continuum
8. **Professionalism:** Demonstrate conduct that reflects core professional values and legal and ethical principles.
9. **Patient-Centered Care:** Utilize the nursing process and knowledge of mental health to provide holistic care to diverse populations across the lifespan.
10. **Strengths:** Determine how Strengths (signature talent themes) influence the role of the student nurse and clinical decision-making.
