Course Description: This course explores evidence-based pharmacotherapeutic nursing interventions to improve patient care. Emphasis is on principles of safe medication administration and patient education. Community, ethical/legal and cultural considerations are explored.

9. **Safety:** Implement measures to promote quality and a safe environment for patients, self, and others.

Grading Scale: Specific guidelines and grading criteria for all assignments are in the Modules. Final grades for the course will be determined based upon the following point assignments:

A - 90-100

B - 80-89

C - 75-79
D - 60-74
F - Below 60

The simple average of all exam grades, including a final, must first be at or above 75% in order to pass the course. Once the student has achieved a simple exam average of 75% or higher, course grades will be determined based on the weighted calculation of exams and other required course work.

Final overall course grades less than 75% are **not** rounded up. The combined weighted calculation of all course assignments, quizzes, exams, and clinical activities must be at least 75% in order to pass the course.

Grade Appeals: Although the university policy allows 60 days for grade appeals, the School of Nursing follows a stricter timeline of 10 days to facilitate students' timely progression through the curriculum. Attendance and Make-up Policy: Attendance/participation is expected. Make-up for exams, quizzes, assignments, and missed clinical time is at the instructor's discretion.

Grade Replacement: Students repeating a course for grade forgiveness (grade replacement) must file a Grade Replacement Contract with the Enrollment Services Center (ADM 230) on or before the Census Date of the semester in which the course will be repeated. Failure to file a Grade Replacement Contract will result in both the original and repeated grade being used to calculate your overall grade point average. Graded Course Requirements Information:

ATI Module Assignments: Each week prior to lecture, you are required to review the applicable ATI online course module and submit a report demonstrating that you have completed the module quiz.

Pharm Phamily Project: Using Studio in Canvas, you will record a power point presentation to share with the class covering the content of one drug of your selection. You will also be responsible for reviewing and commenting on others' videos utilizing the discussion board.

Instructions for Grades on ATI Rubric Regular Courses

For students to gain progressive points on the ATI Rubric each section is added for a final grade. To obtain the points from each section all exams and remediation must be completed as instructed and must be uploaded to the respective canvas assignment tab.

Section 1: ATI Practice Assessment A & B

These two practice tests will be completed at home during a specified week designated by course faculty. During that same week you will be required to complete all remediations for the practice tests. Please see the remediation rubric and instructions in Canvas. If you fail to submit all required remediation objectives by the due date, the assignment will be considered incomplete and result in an automatic zero.

The 40-question custom quizzes must be 85% or greater, set at moderate difficulty, and may be completed in study mode, to be accepted. If the reports are not uploaded by the due date, points will not be awarded.

Each exam and remediation are worth 20 points. No partial points are awarded.

Section 2: ATI Proctored Assessment

The Proctored Assessment is a test that will be administered in a proctored exam environment (computer lab) on campus. The Level and remediation are determined by the proctored assessment score from the exam. Similar to the practice tests, you will be given 1 week to complete all remediations for the proctored test. Please see the remediation rubric and instructions in Canvas. If you fail to submit all required remediation objectives by the due date, the assignment will be considered incomplete and result in an automatic zero for the assignment. No partial points are awarded.

The Proctored Retake Assessment is not required for Level 3. Level 1 and Below Level 1 is required to retake the exam as scheduled by each course. 10 additional points for each additional level improved for the retake assessment may be obtained. (i.e., Below Level 1 scores at Level 1 or higher). Level 2 MAY retake for a higher score to be achieved.

No remediation is required after the retake exam is completed.

No show/no call for the assigned proctored exam may result in zero points.

Section 3: ATI Proctored Retake Assessment

The Proctored Retake Assessment is not required for Level 3. Level 1 or Below Level 1 is required to retake the exam as scheduled by each course. 10 additional points for each additional level improved for the retake assessment may be obtained if the student scores at the next level.

i.e., Below Level 1 scores at Level 1 or higher. Level 2 MAY retake for a higher score to be achieved.

No additional remediation is required after the retaken assessment is completed.
