Course Description: This course for APRN students will integrate advanced health assessment principles and skills into the comprehensive examination process of persons across the lifespan leading to the development of differential diagnosis to support clinical decision-making.

Prerequisites or Co-Requisite: NURS 5350 AND admission to a Nurse Practitioner (NP) or NP Certificate program.

1. Perform comprehensive and focused health assessments across the lifespan, integrating findings from history, physical examination, and diagnostic data to support clinical decision-making.
2. Demonstrate advanced communication skills to elicit accurate health histories, foster patient engagement, and promote culturally responsive, person-centered care.
3. Differentiate normal from abnormal findings to develop differential diagnoses across diverse populations.
4. Apply evidence-based tools, screening guidelines, and risk assessment strategies to identify health promotion needs, disease prevention opportunities, and early signs of illness.
5. Document health assessment findings accurately, concisely, and in accordance with professional, legal, and ethical standards to support clinical decision-making and care coordination.



Respondus LockDown Browser Instructions & Exam Guidelines

Once Installed:

To begin your exam using Respondus LockDown Browser:

1. Start LockDown Browser
2. Log into Canvas
3. Navigate to the exam

Note: You cannot access an exam that requires LockDown Browser using a regular web browser. If attempted, you will receive an error message. To proceed, simply close your standard browser, launch LockDown Browser, and return to the exam.

Exam Guidelines:

When taking an online exam, please follow these important guidelines:

- Choose a quiet, distraction-free location where you are comfortable being recorded via webcam.
- Turn off and put away all other devices (phones, tablets, second computers).
- Know the exam time limit, and ensure you have scheduled enough uninterrupted time to complete the exam.
- Clear your workspace of all unauthorized materials (books, papers, notes, additional devices).
- Remain seated at your computer for the entire duration of the exam.
- If you are using a new computer, Wi-Fi, or location, be sure to run both the Webcam Check and System & Network Check in LockDown Browser before your exam.

Webcam Best Practices:

- Avoid wearing hats or caps with brims.
- Place your device on a firm, stable surface (desk or table); do not place it on your lap, bed, or any soft surface.
- Once the webcam setup is complete, do not move or tilt your screen.
- Choose a well-lit space; avoid sitting with your back to a bright window or light source to prevent backlighting.

Minimum Exam Requirement to Pass the Course:

- To pass this course, the combined average of all four content exams must be 80% or higher, regardless of total course points.

Clinical Component Requirement:

- A passing grade for the clinical component (i.e., video practicums and SOAP notes) is mandatory to earn a final course grade.
- If the clinical component is not passed, the maximum course grade awarded will be a ‘C’, even if other assignments were passed.

Head-To-Toe Checkoff Video Practicum Requirement:

- You MUST PASS the Head-to-Toe Checkoff Video Practicum to pass the course.
- Even if you have sufficient points, you will not pass the course if either practicum is failed.
- Grading Weight:
 - Head-to-Toe Checkoff Video Practicum and accompanying SOAP Note: 10% of total course grade

Dermatology for Primary Care (DFPC) Modules:

- DFPC is a required online dermatology course offering CE credit per module.
- This resource emphasizes pattern recognition and diagnostic clues for common skin conditions.
- As part of NURS 5352, students must complete specific DFPC modules, and:
 - Score at least 80% on each assigned module
 - Upload the Certificate of Completion and the Grade Card for each module

Shadow Health (SH) – (Digital Clinical Experience – DCE):

Shadow Health is an interactive, web-based clinical simulation platform designed to enhance students' clinical reasoning, patient assessment, and communication skills in a safe, virtual environment. It is used nationally across nurse practitioner and other health professions programs to bridge didactic learning and clinical practice. Shadow Health is a required component of this course and plays a critical role in developing your virtual assessment and clinical reasoning skills.

In this course, SH provides you with access to Digital Clinical Experiences (DCEs), which simulate patient encounters using advanced virtual patients. These modules allow you to:

- Practice and demonstrate head-to-toe assessments and focused physical exams
- Take comprehensive patient health histories
- Develop differential diagnoses
- Improve therapeutic communication and clinical documentation

Students Must:

- Purchase access to Shadow Health through the UT Tyler Bookstore Bundle OR by using the Elsevier Access Code that will be provided to you during the first week of the Spring 2026 semester.
- Complete assigned modules by the specified due dates posted in Canvas.
- Submit performance summaries or grades as outlined in module instructions.

Clinical Course Requirements – NURS 5352 – Advanced Health Assessment for Nurse**Practitioners:****Clinical Hours Requirement:**

NURS 5352 is a 14-week course that requires the successful completion of a minimum of 20 clinical hours. These hours are embedded into the course and do not require a preceptor. Clinical hours are earned through:

- Completion of Shadow Health Digital Clinical Experience (DCE) modules
- Participation in the Head-to-Toe Checkoff Video Practicum

Students should expect to dedicate approximately 1.5-2 hours per week toward achieving the 20-hour clinical requirement.

Clinical Attire Requirements for Skills Check-Offs:

Professional clinical attire is mandatory when recording the Head-to-Toe Checkoff Video Practicum. **MANDATOR REQUIRED** Attire includes:

- White lab coat with the UT Tyler School of Nursing patch (on the left chest area)
- UT Tyler student or clinical ID badge

General Attire Guidelines:

- Clothing must be clean, pressed, and professional
- Men: Button-up shirt tucked in with a belt; ties are optional
- Women: Professional dresses, skirts, or pants with modest blouses (no cleavage)
- Unacceptable attire: Running shoes, jeans, frayed clothing, or casual wear

Note: In future clinical courses, scrubs may be worn only if explicitly approved by your clinical preceptor and specific to that clinical site. Scrubs are not the standard attire for nurse practitioners in most outpatient settings.

Remember, you are representing UT Tyler and the nurse practitioner profession—dress accordingly and maintain a professional appearance at all times during clinical-related activities.

Clinical Hours Documentation: Although no preceptor documentation is required in this course, your clinical hours may be entered into the clinical placement software (as designated in Canvas) by your assigned faculty upon successful completion of the course.

Students are expected to obtain access to the clinical placement software platform used by the School of Nursing, as it may be required for clinical hour documentation.
