**Course Description:**

This course will explore major world cultures and concepts of spirituality. Emphasis will be on the application of the topics to scholarly interests.

1. Differentiate between the major world religions.
2. Explore culturally congruent communication and practice.
3. Examine spiritual care related to different patient groups.
4. Explore culture and/or spiritual literature in the context of healthcare.
5. Synthesize a literature review into a presentation.
