Course Description: This graduate-level course is designed to enhance the clinical assessment skills of nurse practitioner students through the integration of advanced health assessment principles, evidence-based practice, and diagnostic reasoning. Emphasis is placed on developing proficiency in conducting comprehensive and focused physical examinations, interpreting clinical findings, and formulating differential diagnoses across diverse populations and age groups. Students will refine techniques in history taking, physical examination, and clinical decision-making with attention to common and complex deviations from normal. This course prepares students for advanced clinical practice by fostering critical thinking and diagnostic acumen essential for safe and effective patient care.

Prerequisites or Co-Requisite: NURS 5350 AND admission to a Nurse Practitioner (NP) or NP Certificate program.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate the ability to obtain and document a comprehensive health history for individuals across the lifespan.
2. Perform a risk assessment of the patient including the assessment of lifestyle and other risk factors.
3. Assess the health promotion behaviors of individuals across the lifespan.
4. Perform and document a complete advanced physical examination of individuals across the lifespan utilizing the full extent of the student's education and training.
5. Perform basic assessment tests and interpret pertinent laboratory and diagnostic data.
6. Relate assessment findings to underlying pathophysiology.
7. Analyze assessment data to determine differential diagnoses.
8. Analyze assessment data to determine nursing diagnoses.
9. Develop an effective and appropriate plan of care for the patient that is research based (evidence-based practice) and take into consideration life circumstances, cultural, ethnic, and developmental variations.
10. Utilize the skills of advanced nursing assessment and an understanding of advanced practice nursing roles and evidence-based data collection to provide effective continuity of care among collaborating healthcare providers.

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Course Structure

This course is structured as an online self-paced learning environment. ****Only** when the clinical component is passed will the student be awarded a course grade based on the scored evaluation items listed above. Failing to complete any clinical component satisfactorily will result in an overall course grade no higher than a C.

*****You MUST PASS** the MID-TERM and FINAL Head to Toe Checkoff Video Practicums to PASS the course. Even if you have enough points to pass otherwise, you will not pass the course without passing the practicums. The Midterm SOAP is worth 10% of the total course grade and the Final SOAP note is worth 10% of the total course grade.

Clinical Course Requirements Information:**Clinical Hours Required**

NURS 5352 is a 20 clinical hour, 14-week course. The Shadow Health Module Assessments and Participation in the MIDTERM and FINAL Skills check-off sessions compile these clinical hours. Students can expect a minimum of 1.5 hours of work toward this goal per week. A minimum of 20 clinical hours is required for satisfactory completion of this course (no preceptor is needed for this course since clinical hours are embedded)

Clinical Attire

Appropriate Clinical Attire for video recording of the MIDTERM and FINAL Head to Toe Check-Off Videos for Skills Check-off Submission is Standard and Mandatory. This includes a white lab coat with the UT Tyler School of Nursing Patch placed on the left chest area and your UT Tyler student or clinical ID badge. This professional clinical attire is to be always worn while in the clinical area.

All clothing should be clean, pressed, with no frayed hems showing. Men are to wear button up shirts that are tucked in and a belt. Ties are optional. Ladies are to wear professional dresses or pants and shirts that do not show cleavage. Running shoes and jeans are considered unacceptable and may result in dismissal from the clinic for the day. **In other clinical courses**, should a preceptor advise the student to wear scrubs then this is permitted only in that preceptor's setting. Scrubs are not the normal attire of NPs in clinics. Students should ask their preceptor how they should dress prior to arrival at the clinical site. Remember, UT Tyler NP students are representing themselves and the university as future NP's and need to look at the part.
