# PHAR 7281 Introduction to Pharmacy Practice Experience - 1 Fall 2024

# **Course Description**

This course focuses on acquiring and practicing basic knowledge and skills required for upcoming pharmacy practice experiences including Immunization Certification and participation in patient care events.

#### **Additional Course Information**

This course introduces students to the profession of pharmacy by providing an overview of skills and responsibilities for rotations. The didactic component of this course prepares students for introductory pharmacy practice experiences. Additionally, students will complete the APhA Pharmacy-Based Immunization certification program. For the experiential education component of the course, students complete a series of shadowing experiences in various pharmacy practice settings. The structure of this course allows application and integration of knowledge and skills gained from the didactic curriculum while developing behaviors and attitudes needed as a pharmacist.

1	Skills Assessment	Students will be evaluated by an APhA-certified trainer on their immunization administration techniques for intramuscular and subcutaneous immunizations. The APhA rubric for skills assessment will be utilized.
2	Individual Assignment	Students will be assessed on their development of a professional, electronic portfolio in MyCred. A rubric will be used to assess the assignment.
3	Individual Applications	Students will be assessed on their knowledge and ability to apply gained knowledge through individual applications, including, but not limited to iRATs, learning issues, and/or quizzes.
4	Observation	Students will be observed on their engagement in professionalism and readiness activities for experiential education through their participation, attendance (including timeliness), dress, and completion of READINESS modules in CORE ELMS and health and wellness hours.  Application of knowledge and skills will be assessed through observation by a preceptor and using the rotation Competency Evaluation (midpoint and final)  O Preceptors will evaluate student competency and professionalism using the rotation Competency Evaluation.
5	Internship (Rotation Assessments)	Students will be evaluated on their completion of activities and demonstration of professionalism at various rotation sites.  Shadowing Assignment (Graded Reflection)  Students will be evaluated on their reflection of the shadowing experience with a rubric. Included is a projection in which students can relate the shadowing experience to upcoming didactic and experiential coursework.
6	Written Exams	Students will be assessed on their knowledge of immunizations through a written exam to evaluate their knowledge and comprehension, measured by points. The APhA Certification Exam and a course final exam will be administered. The final course exam will include content from immunizations as well as from course and rotation content.

## **Grading Policy & Grade Calculation**

Grades will be determined based on evaluation of individual and team readiness assessment tests (iRATs, tRATs), individual and team cumulative assessment tests (iCATs, tCATs), midterm examinations, final written examinations, skills assessments, graded application assignments, participation in team-based projects, peer evaluations and other assessment methods that may include, but not limited to, Objective Structured Clinical Examinations (OSCEs). Examinations, RATs and CATs may consist of, but not limited to, multiple-choice, true/false, fill in the blank, short-answer, essay, and problem-based questions.

All examinations, tests, and assignments, including the final examination, may be **cumulative**. Students are responsible for material presented during prior courses. The grading scale for all graded material is below.
