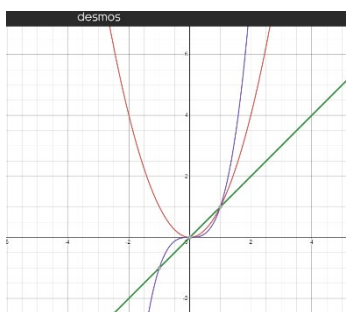


These are some additional online materials that may help you understand subjects relating to math outside of tutoring hours.
