Course Description

This laboratory course focuses on the application of skills and resources needed for pharmacists to effectively provide patient care in the outpatient setting.

Additional Course Information

This course will expand upon the foundational pharmacy patient care skills taught in the curriculum thus far at an advanced level. This course will prepare the student for experiential rotation in the outpatient setting by enhancing their skills on medication therapy management, point of care testing, patient and provider communications, prescription dispensing, and working up patients with more complex medical and personal issues. This course will also include successful completion of the ComMIT Motivational Interviewing online module series.

The final course grade will be assigned according to the calculated percentage and the percentages will not be rounded upward or downward.
