Course Description: 7-week online course in conjunction with the End of Life Nursing Education Consortium. ELNEC online curriculum was designed to integrate palliative care in undergraduate nursing education and new nurse graduates across the nation. The online format means the ELNEC curriculum is equally available to students in rural areas and helps standardize palliative care nursing education.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1) Professionalism: Demonstrate professional behavior and ethical decision-making processes considering the unique needs of patients receiving palliative care.
- 2) Patient-Centered Care: Select and apply a plan of care that is patient-centered and holistic, reflecting the specialized needs of patients dealing receiving palliative care.
- 3) Evidenced-Based Practice (EBP): Recognize the role of evidence-based practice in providing safe and effective care for the palliative care patient.
- 4) Informatics & Technology: Examine the importance and use of informatics and technology in delivering quality care and developing astute clinical decision-making skills in the palliative care environment.
- 5) Quality Improvement: Compare quality improvement initiatives for chronic health conditions and its relation to the improvement of patient outcomes and healthcare delivery systems.

6) Teamwork and Collaboration: Demonstrate effective inter-professional communication skills to achieve quality patient care through collaborative efforts focused on palliative care considerations.

7) Leadership: Examine the effect of leadership and patient advocacy on nursing practice directed to the palliative care patient.

8) Safety: Apply appropriate safety measures that reduce patient safety risks and fosters a safe working environment in the palliative care setting.
