This program follows a hybrid format, combining primarily online coursework with required on campus learning experiences. Students are expected to attend on-campus sessions or clinical activities as part of their training. It is important to plan ahead for any necessary work adjustments during core courses and clinical practicums to ensure academic success and professional growth.

Course Description

This foundational course is designed for advanced practice nurses specializing in the care of individuals with mental and substance use disorders. Emphasizing a neurobiological perspective, the course explores key mental disorders across the lifespan. It examines multifactorial causes, including developmental, genetic, injury, trauma, infection and neurodegeneration. The course also delves into the maintenance of homeostasis within the mind-body relationship, with a focus on the neurobiological underpinnings of mental disorders.

Students will integrate neurobiological principles with psychopharmacologic treatment modalities and pharmacogenomics, analyze the neurobiological mechanisms of psychotropic drugs, and develop strategies to enhance patient care through a deeper understanding of neurobiology.

Prerequisites: NURS 5350 Advanced Pathophysiology; NURS 5352 Advanced Health Assessment; NURS 5354 Advanced Pharmacotherapeutics

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. **Integrate neurobiological principles with psychopharmacological treatment modalities and pharmacogenomics across the lifespan.**
(AACN Domain 1(Knowledge for Nursing Practice (knowledge is required in clinical neuroscience, knowledge that provides the scientific, clinical, and theoretical foundation)., PI 1.3(Demonstrate clinical judgment founded on a broad knowledge base.”). Aligns with AACN Domain 2 (Essential Knowledge), PI 2.4(Diagnose actual or potential health problems and needs.” PI 2.4g(Integrate advanced scientific knowledge to guide decision making.”). This alignment ensures that advanced-level nurses can synthesize biological, genetic, and neurobiological data to provide tailored, evidence-based pharmacological care.
2. **Analyze the relationships between neurobiological mechanisms and the actions of psychotropic drugs in psychiatric illnesses.**
(AACN Domain 1, PI 1.3 above). The analysis of neurobiological mechanisms and drug action is crucial for **Empirical Knowing** (a subset of Domain 1), which involves synthesizing biological, psychological, and physiological symptoms into evidence-based plans of care
3. **Apply neurobiological concepts in the assessment and treatment of psychiatric disease states across the lifespan.** (AACN Domain 2(Person-Centered Care (Focuses on holistic, individualized, and developmentally appropriate care across the lifespan). PI 2.3; PI 2.6). For Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs/PMHNPs), this involves applying neurobiology to assess and manage mental health conditions across the life span.
4. **Identify and explain the neurobiological targets for psychotropic medications.**
(AACN Domain 1, PI 1.3): Domain 1 focuses on the integration of core scientific knowledge—including pathophysiology, pharmacology, and neuroscience—into nursing practice to inform clinical judgment. Understanding the neurobiological targets (synapses, receptors, neurotransmitters) of psychotropic medications is foundational to this domain

5. **Develop strategies to enhance patient care, self-awareness, and accountability through a neurobiological understanding of psychiatric conditions and treatments.** (AACN Domain 2, PI 2.4; AACN Domain 9, PI 9.1)

- **Domain 2: Person-Centered Care (2.8/2.8i):** Focuses on developing strategies to enhance patient care, such as "Identify barriers to self-care and develop strategies to address them" (2.8) and using psychopharmacological knowledge to formulate treatment plans.

Special Course Notes:

- a. Proctoring Notice: Four Exams will be given ONLINE, using a proctored service called **Respondus Lock-Down Browser**. You must download Respondus Lock-Down Browser at the beginning of the semester. This software is available at no cost to students.
- b. Students who are not able to obtain the required course equipment above must contact the faculty **by the second week of the course** so alternative testing arrangements (on-campus) can be made. Details on using Respondus Monitor and setting up the webcam will be available in the Canvas course.

- Start Lockdown Browser
- Log into to Canvas
- Navigate to the exam

Note: You will not be able to access an exam that requires Lockdown Browser with a standard web browser. If this is tried, an error message will indicate that the test requires the use of LockDown Browser. Simply start Lockdown Browser and navigate back to the exam to continue.

Additionally, you will not be able to access the exam if you have any other window or tab open on your device, or if you have other screens attached to your device.

Guidelines

When taking an online exam follow these guidelines:

- Select a location where you will not be interrupted or distracted.
- Before starting the test, know how much time is available for it, and that you've allotted sufficient time to complete it.
- Turn off all mobile devices, phones, etc. and don't have them within reach

***The average of your four (4) exams must be greater than or equal to 80 to pass the course. Points from items 2-4 above will only be added after your average score of 80. You will not pass the course without making an 80 average on the four (4) exams.**

Grading Scale:

Specific guidelines and grading criteria for all assignments are in the Modules. Final grades for the course will be determined based upon the following point assignments:

- A - 90-100
- B - 80-89
- C - 70-79
- D - 60-69
- F - Below 60

Grades will not be rounded when calculating the average (79.5 is not rounded to 80, and 89.5 is not rounded to 90). The simple average of all unit exam grades, including a final must be at or above 80% in order to pass the course. Once the student has achieved a simple unit exam average of 80% or higher, course grades will be determined based on the weighted calculation of exams and other required course work. Students are required to achieve an average of 80% (B) to complete the course successfully.

1) Exams (60% of total grade; 50 possible points per exam)

- ***Exams in the course will be given online, Lockdown Browser + Webcam. With Lockdown browser, students are unable to open other tabs on their computers to seek resources while the exam is on.***
- Students must not take pictures or copies of the exams.
- **Exams must be taken during the date and time specifically designated. Scheduled exam dates will not be changed unless in very extreme cases (Not guaranteed). As such, students must plan their schedules ahead of the scheduled examination dates.**
- If for any extreme reason, there is an alternate date, **the exam will be comprised of essay and fill-in-the-blank questions.**
- **Exam dates are listed in the Course Calendar.**
- Students must achieve an **AVERAGE** of 80 on all four exams to pass the course. Even though you may have enough percentage in other areas to raise your overall grade, you still will not pass the course without an 80 overall **AVERAGE** on all exams.

- The module objectives and assigned readings will guide the selection of items for the tests. Emphasis will be on application and synthesis of knowledge.
 - **Exam 1 will cover Modules 1-4**
 - **Exam 2 will cover Modules 5-6**
 - **Exam 3 will cover Modules 7,8,9**
 - **Exam 4 will cover Modules 10, 11 and 12**

2) Weekly Quizzes (20% of total grade)

There will be short quizzes throughout the weekly modules. These quizzes will open on Mondays and close on Sundays by 11:59pm The combined total of points for all quizzes will account for 20% of the final grade.

3) Discussion Boards (10% of total grade)

Discussion boards may include a variety of topics relevant to the weekly module content in order to enhance learning. **Initial responses are due by day 3 (Wednesday) and two peer responses on different days are due by day 7 (Sunday).**

4) Assignments: (10% of total grade). Due dates are located within the course in Canvas.

Guideline for Similarity Scores and Deductions.

Turnitin Similarity Range	Interpretation	Typical Faculty Action or Grade Deduction
0–15%	Excellent originality; appropriate use of sources and citations.	No deduction
16–25%	Acceptable if overlap is mainly from references, quotes, or templates.	May be reviewed for excessive quoting or weak paraphrasing. Up to 5% deduction possible.
26–35%	Moderate similarity; may reflect overuse of direct language or poor paraphrasing.	5–10% deduction or request for revision.
36–50%	High similarity; significant originality concerns.	10–20% deduction, and faculty may require resubmission or academic integrity review
Over 50%	Unacceptable level of similarity; likely plagiarism.	Automatic zero (0) and potential referral to the Academic Integrity Committee.

Important Notes Similarity from reference lists, assignment headers, or required templates is not penalized if formatted correctly. Students may resubmit assignments before the due date to reduce similarity and improve originality. Faculty reserve the right to use discretion in

determining penalties based on the nature of the overlap, the student's intent, and the overall circumstances of the submission. Withdrawing from Class: Students, you are allowed to [withdraw](#) (drop) from this course through the University's Withdrawal Portal. The "I" may be assigned in lieu of a grade only when all of the following conditions are met: (a) the student has been making satisfactory progress in the course; (b) the student is unable to complete all course work or final exam due to unusual circumstances that are beyond personal control and are acceptable to the instructor, and (c) the student presents these reasons prior to the time that the final grade roster is due. The semester credit hours for an Incomplete will not be used to calculate the grade point average for a student.

The student and the instructor must submit an Incomplete Form detailing the work required and the time by which the work must be completed to their respective department chair or

college dean for approval. The time limit established must not exceed one year. Should the student fail to complete all of the work for the course within the time limit, then the instructor may assign zeros to the unfinished work, compute the course average for the student, and assign the appropriate grade. If a grade has not been assigned within one year, then the Incomplete will be changed to an F or NC if the course was originally taken under the CR/NC grading basis.

Grade Appeal Policy: UT Tyler's Grade Appeal policy requires the completion of a Grade Appeal form for this action to take place. The grade appeal begins with the instructor of your course. If you do not agree with the decision of the instructor, you may then move your appeal to the department chair/school director for that course. If you are still dissatisfied with the decision of the chair/director, you may move the appeal to the dean of the college offering that course, who has the final decision.
