Portfolio Review Guidelines and Application for the BFA Degree Program

DEPARTMENT OF ART & ART HISTORY | UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT TYLER

All students declaring studio art as a major at the University of Texas at Tyler are subject to the portfolio review process if a Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) Degree is desired.

B.F. A. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Students wanting to pursue the B.F.A. degree program of study must, within the first nine (9) hours of studio course work at UT Tyler, submit a portfolio to the Faculty Review Committee. Upon approval from the Faculty Review Committee, students will be admitted and may complete a B.F.A. degree plan with an undergraduate art advisor. If the student is denied entry into the B.F.A. degree program, they will be put on probationary status and may submit another portfolio the following semester. The Faculty Review Committee upon request from the student may waive the review process. If, after two portfolio reviews, the student is not admitted to the B.F.A. degree program, course work done after the eighteen (18) hour review will *not* apply towards the B.F.A. in Art degree. At this point, the student will need to change his or her major within the University of Texas at Tyler and an alternate degree option is the B.A. in Art.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Students who transfer with six accepted credit hours of studio art courses and want to pursue the B.F.A. degree program of study must, within the first 6-9 hours of studio work at UT Tyler, submit a portfolio review to the Faculty Review Committee. Upon approval from the Faculty Review Committee, students will be admitted and may complete a B.F.A. degree plan with an undergraduate art advisor. If the student is denied entry into the B.F.A. degree program, they will be put on probationary status and may submit another portfolio the following semester. The Faculty Review Committee upon request from the student may waive the review process. If, after two portfolio reviews, the student is not admitted to the B.F.A. degree program, course work done after the eighteen (18) hour review will not apply towards the B.F.A. in Art degree. At this point, the student will need to change his or her major within the University of Texas at Tyler and an alternate degree option is the B.A. in Art.

PLEASE NOTE:

Students who do not participate in the portfolio review within the allotted time frame listed above will automatically be put on probationary status-it will be an automatic failure for the first portfolio review. If the second review is missed within the allotted time frame the student will be denied admittance to the B.F.A. degree program.

If you are confused about when to go up for portfolio review, it is essential that you contact Professor Serio for your status. Contact information is listed on the application form.

- The B.F.A. Portfolio Review takes place each semester and all submissions are digital.
- Deadlines for submissions take place towards the end of the semester. Students will be informed of deadlines well in advance.
- All applications must be turned in to Professor Serio at <u>aserio@uttyler.edu</u> using the format described below. PLEASE FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY!
- Notice of BFA status (acceptance, probation, rejection) will be sent in the mail.

- **-Page 1: APPLICATION FORM-** Completed Portfolio Review Application Form. Please read carefully and complete this form according to instructions.
- -Pages 2-6 / 2-9: IMAGES- A minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8 pieces of work from the most recent studio courses taken at UT Tyler. Artworks may be of diverse materials and subject matter, but MUST be completed during coursework at UT Tyler.

NOTE: Below each image on the same page, please include the following inventory information:

- a) name, b) artwork title, c) media/materials d) approximate dimensions, e) semester and class of creation
- -Pages following images: WRITING SAMPLE- A writing sample from an art history course (2-3 pages) taken at UT Tyler (formal/content analysis, critical response, or a research paper). You may use an artist statement or writing sample from a studio course if you have not taken an art history course at UT Tyler.

PLEASE NOTE:

The BFA degree is a highly specialized degree in which the degree candidate should expect, after graduation, to continue on as a professional artist. In addition to the materials presented in the portfolio review, your studio and art history GPA, class participation, attendance, attitude, and perceived dedication to art as a future career are all taken into account during faculty review process.
