Fall 2011 – Spring 2017 Director of Introduction to Fiction and Poetry The Writing Seminars The Johns Hopkins University

I continued to work with Jean McGarry and Mary Jo Salter, Co-chairs of The Writing Seminars, to redesign Introduction to Fiction and Poetry, our introductory courses in creative short fiction and metered verse. I direct sixty-eight sections of IFP—the most popular course at Hopkins—twenty graduate students, seven adjuncts, 1,156 undergraduates a year. The undergraduate enrollment at Johns Hopkins is 4,700 students.

Fall 2008 – Spring 2011 Director of Introduction to Fiction and Poetry The Writing Seminars The Johns Hopkins University

I worked with Dave Smith, Chair of The Writing Seminars, to redesign Introduction to Fiction and Poetry. Every August, I direct orientation for all IFP instructors. Every semester, I visit thirty-four sections of Introduction to Fiction and Poetry and then meet with each instructor to discuss my observations. I call bimonthly meetings with these fine teachers to share suggestions on how to better teach fiction and poetry. At the end of every academic year, I meet with each IFP instructor to recommend improvements and praise accomplishments in the last two semesters.

Fall 1999 – Spring 2006 Associate Director The Creative Writing Program The University of Houston

I worked with John McNamara, Chair of the English Department, and James Kastely, Director of the Creative Writing Program, to create the undergraduate curriculum in Creative Writing. I helped develop the "creative concentration" for the three hundred students in the English Department who major in Creative Writing. I worked to lower the ceiling, the maximum enrollment, in undergraduate Creative Writing workshops from forty students to thirty. I worked to reduce the teaching load of the graduate students from four classes each semester in 1980 to three classes in 1990 to two in 2000. I coordinated, instructed, observed the one hundred graduate students in the Creative Writing Program.
