

# **EMBA-HCM Additional Policies**

Policy information for UT Tyler students can be found in the <u>University Catalog</u>. In addition to these policies, EMBA-HCM students are also held to the following standards:

#### **UT TYLER HONOR CODE**

I embrace honor and integrity. Therefore, I choose not to lie, cheat, or steal, nor to accept the actions of those who do.

Failure to embrace the <u>UT Tyler Honor Code</u> may result in removal from the EMBA-HCM program.

### **TUITION/FEES LATE PAYMENTS**

EMBA-HCM students are expected to render payment for their posted program bills by the first business day prior to the start date of the standard 15-week session. Failure to render payment by this date will result in being dropped from courses for the semester. It is the student's responsibility to request reenrollment and make plans for payment through Financial Aid or the Cashiers Office. Should payment not be rendered by the Census Date the student may be removed from the Executive MBA Healthcare Management track. Students may transfer courses out of the EMBA-HCM program toward the general MBA program.

### **ACADEMIC PROBATION/SUSPENSION**

Per the catalog, "a graduate student who has a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.0 will be placed on academic probation." Should an EMBA-HCM student be placed on academic probation and their EMBA-HCM program cumulative grade point average is less than 3.0 they will be removed from the Executive MBA Healthcare Management track. Students may transfer courses out of the EMBA-HCM program toward the general MBA program. Students must follow the academic probation policies as outlined in the catalog to move forward in their academic studies under the general MBA program.

## GRADE(S) BELOW "C"

Per the catalog, "No course with a grade below "C" may be applied toward this degree." Should an EMBA-HCM student earn a grade below a "C", during the program sequence, they will be removed from the Executive MBA Healthcare Management track. Students may transfer courses out of the EMBA-HCM program toward the general MBA program.
