Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

President updates (Dr. Julie Philley, President)

- New interim Chief Legal Officer, David Northcutt
- New Athletic Director, Dr. Sam Ferguson from ACU will join April 7
- Open searches
 - Dean for the Fisch College of Pharmacy
 - Dean of the Grad School
 - Leader for Behavioral Health
 - COO of North Campus
- Reminder about homecoming on April 11 and 12 please participate
- In general, not a super friendly higher ed session in the Legislature, but expect more emphasis on other things
 - Will look at FS and curriculum
 - Thank you for work on info for SB17 review proud of work we do on this campus and saw nothing concerning – able to meet open records request for all information on SOM
- Remote work
 - Federal level going away state will look at some level
 - Big proponent of flexibility document staff with HR in proper channels
- Master plan
 - o Feedback has been encouraging
 - Stairs are still on track to open the first week of May will open up
 - Working on timelines and budgets for further upkeep looking at all kinds of funding sources – will provide timeline in near future
- Important to keep each honest and stay united as a campus
- Question: What are you most worried about? Response: Not a huge worrier, feel responsible for us to stay focused on success of our students and not get bogged down in what is going on beyond our campus.
- Question: Students seem less able to handle critical thinking as well as mental health issues. What do we really know about long term problems from COVID?

- Response: Solution is how to address and help change perspective to make them stronger
- Comment: Great to see the changes with walkability and want to acknowledge great relationship with productive engagement

Provost Updates (Dr. Amir Mirmiran, Provost)

- Announcement coming about graduate dean candidates coming to visit for interviews – presentations will be open to faculty
- Candidates for the Pharmacy Dean will be on campus in next few weeks
- CPL (Credit for Prior Learning)
 - Working on process for this and want feedback
 - o Focus is on BAAS at this time
 - Draft will be presented at next meeting
- Al proposals 9 across campus; will be reviewed in the next 2 weeks and then a
 group will make a pitch to the committee and then awarded in April
- OER encourage to attend the presentations through CETL with three different perspectives of how to integrate including AI
- Credit to Dr. Swain for implementing for adding "Uber for Tutor" model for tutoring
 make sure you discuss with your students
- Textbook adoption for fall by deadline of April 15
- Question: Will opportunities be provided? Response: OER already sent from CETL via email April 9 1:30-3:30 p.m.
- Question: Is Follett a good change? Response: Challenge has not been their fault –
 contract has been on month-to-month but have not been able to complete the
 contract due to some issues that are currently being worked on to resolve.
 Response from Stephanie Fenter working to understand and please bring any
 challenges to her

Budget updates (Dwain Morris, Chief Financial Officer)

- Future budget working on revenue estimates for next year
- Meeting with Deans and Administration to get help to become more precise in projections
- If you have things that you haven't done yet consider pushing out to next business year (delay expenditure) which will help reach goal
- Question: How does projected loss compare to other UT Systems? Response: Only one other runs in negative; most run 1-3% gain

- Breakdown of Total Operating Revenue Tuition and fees that are non-auxiliary are about \$70-80 million; state appropriations about \$50-55 million
- Question: Why are we and one other the only running negative? Response: Others are bigger institutions and can spread cost easier; a lot is our spending habits
- Pell grants close to \$30 million Not at risk of losing Pell grant funding this year
- Question: When will you come back for deeper explanation? Response: Will come next quarter – hopefully June

Legislative updates (Courtney Smith, Associate Vice President for Government Relations)

- SB37 was heard in Committee a week ago today and was present for all of testimony
 - o very engaged committee hearing
 - o committee had questions for almost every presenters
 - Today written with Faculty Senate as advisory only, term lengths of service on Senate, establishes a general education review committee, hiring practices that will put more things at the Board of Regents level, lays out expectations of a Regent
- Request for info from SOM only had 48 hours to respond very thankful for responsiveness
- Federal Level NIH IDC injunction now in place so no cap as of today
- DOE still requires congressional action
- 3 UT Tyler students interning in government offices one in the Governor's office, one in the Lieutenant Governor's office, and one in a House Members office
- Question: What are you hearing about the continuing carve outs for SB17?
 Response: Only one that currently removes it are only targeted to dentistry and medicine.
- Question: And how do you think the curriculum? Response: only hearing about core and not any mention for upper-level courses
- Question: Is there evidence of push back (HB 2899) Response: Committee is truly wanting feedback and to understand environment of higher ed
- Question: Faculty with courses such as African American Literature are concerned about being fired – should they be worried? Response: no matter what happens we need to be honest about what we can and cannot do; not going to have firings without conversations and looking for creative solutions; statement from committee – we don't want to hurt higher ed – just want to make it better
- Question: What is your personal assessment of their motivations? How close are they to Vance's position? Are you serious about their altruistic approach? Dr.

Philley's response: everyone in meetings in Austin has been very supportive of UT Tyler Response from Courtney: a couple of institutions have brought the focus onto higher education but can't speak to every politicians position.

- Comment: Committee substitute for SB37 will be biggest sign if they are on our side or not
- Comment: Look at Promise for a show of support
