# East Texas Area Economic Overview\*

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### **Demographic Profile**

The population in the East Texas was 1,143,378 per American Community Survey data for 2015-2019. The region has a civilian labor force of 501,851 with a participation rate of 55.6%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the East Texas, 18.7% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 33.5% in the nation. The median household income in the East Texas 23 is \$50,985 and the median house value is \$124,675.



## **Unemployment Rate**

The unemployment rate for the East Texas was 4.9% as of January 2022. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 4.4%. One year earlier, in January 2021, the unemployment rate in the East Texas was 7.2%.



## Wage Trends

The average worker in the East Texas earned annual wages of \$45,027 as of 2021Q3. Average annual wages per worker increased 3.8% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$64,555 in the nation as of 2021Q3.

## **Cost of Living Index**

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 10.7% lower in East Texas than the U.S. average.

## **Occupation Snapshot**

The largest major occupation group in the East Texas is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 55,002 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (45,609 workers) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (40,845). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 1.31), Construction and Extraction Occupations (1.28), and Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (1.23).

Occupation groups in the East Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$92,400), Management Occupations (\$88,400), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$80,200). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.8% among Legal Occupations to 13.3% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the East Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.1% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+755 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+493). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (7,185 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (6,379).



## **Industry Clusters**

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the East Texas with the highest relative concentration is Coal/Oil/Power with a location quotient of 3.14. This cluster employs 11,794 workers in the region with an average wage of \$84,669. Employment in the Coal/Oil/Power cluster is projected to expand in the region about 1.1% per year over the next ten years.




Industry Clusters for East Texas 23 as of 2021Q3

## **Education Levels**

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the East Texas is projected to grow 0.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.0% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.8% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.9% per year.




### Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Training Required for East T

#### **Gross Domestic Product**


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2020, nominal GDP in the East Texas contracted 6.6%. This follows growth of 1.0% in 2019. As of 2020, total GDP in the East Texas was \$43,226,743,000.

Of the sectors in the East Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2020, \$7,696,806,000 The next-largest contributions came from Health Care and Social Assistance (\$4,849,479,000); Retail Trade (\$3,324,533,000); and Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$3,021,729,000).
