# **Demographic Profile**

The population in Anderson County, Texas was 57,917 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020. The region has a civilian labor force of 19,817 with a participation rate of 41.2%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Anderson County, Texas, 9.7% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation. The median household income in Anderson County, Texas is \$45,847 and the median house value is \$110,000.



# **Unemployment Rate**


The unemployment rate for Anderson County, Texas was 3.2% as of October 2022. The regional unemployment rate was lower than the national rate of 3.4%. One year earlier, in October 2021, the unemployment rate in Anderson County, Texas was 4.0%.

# Wage Trends

The average worker in Anderson County, Texas earned annual wages of \$52,535 as of 2022Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 11.0% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$67,777 in the nation as of 2022Q2.

# **Cost of Living Index**

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 10.2% lower in Anderson County, Texas than the U.S. average.

## **Occupation Snapshot**

The largest major occupation group in Anderson County, Texas is Transportation and Material Moving Occupations, employing 3,302 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (2,609 workers) and Management Occupations (1,943). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Protective Service Occupations (LQ = 2.35), Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (1.67), and Management Occupations (1.26).

Occupation groups in Anderson County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$92,200), Management Occupations (\$87,200), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$85,200). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.2% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 6.3% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Anderson County, Texas is expected to be Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations with a +1.9% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+31 jobs) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (+30). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (414 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (306).



Wages by occupation are as of 2021 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

## **Industry Clusters**

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Anderson County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Food Mfg. with a location quotient of 3.29. This cluster employs 880 workers in the region with an average wage of \$36,111. Employment in the Food Mfg. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.4% per year over the next ten years.




Industry Clusters for Anderson County, Texas as of 2022Q2

## **Education Levels**

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Anderson County, Texas is projected to grow 0.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.0% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.0% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.0% per year.




#### Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Training Required

#### **Gross Domestic Product**


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2021, nominal GDP in Anderson County, Texas expanded 17.1%. This follows a contraction of 2.4% in 2020. As of 2021, total GDP in Anderson County, Texas was \$2,369,498,000.

Of the sectors in Anderson County, Texas, Transportation and Warehousing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2021, \$256,643,000 The next-largest contributions came from Manufacturing (\$251,106,000); Public Administration (\$202,822,000); and Information (\$168,261,000).
