

Lamar County Economic Overview

Demographic Profile

The population in Lamar County, Texas was 49,705 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020. The region has a civilian labor force of 23,080 with a participation rate of 58.8%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Lamar County, Texas, 18.9% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation. The median household income in Lamar County, Texas is \$48,036 and the median house value is \$108,500.



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Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for Lamar County, Texas was 4.2% as of October 2022. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 3.4%. One year earlier, in October 2021, the unemployment rate in Lamar County, Texas was 5.0%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through October 2022.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Lamar County, Texas earned annual wages of \$47,589 as of 2022Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 7.3% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$67,777 in the nation as of 2022Q2.

Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2022Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q2.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 12.4% lower in Lamar County, Texas than the U.S. average.

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Lamar County, Texas is Production Occupations, employing 3,964 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (2,810 workers) and Sales and Related Occupations (2,087). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 2.82), Healthcare Support Occupations (1.28), and Management Occupations (1.15).

Occupation groups in Lamar County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$90,500), Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$85,100), and Management Occupations (\$84,300). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.4% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 7.7% among Personal Care and Service Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Lamar County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+35 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+31). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Production Occupations (436 jobs) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (338).


3. Data represent found online ads active within the last thirty days in the selected region; data represents a sampling rather than the complete universe of postings. Ads lacking zip code information but designating a place (city, town, etc.) may be assigned to the zip code with greatest employment in that place for queries in this analytic. Due to alternative county-assignment algorithms, ad counts in this analytic may not match that shown in RTI (nor in the popup window ad list).

Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2022Q1, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q2. Wages by occupation are as of 2021 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Lamar County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Auto/Auto-related with a location quotient of 5.71. This cluster employs 2,359 workers in the region with an average wage of \$55,971. Employment in the Auto/Auto-related cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.2% per year over the next ten years.


Industry Clusters for Lamar County, Texas as of 2022Q2

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Lamar County, Texas is projected to grow 0.6% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.1% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.8% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.0% per year.

Gross Domestic Product


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2021, nominal GDP in Lamar County, Texas expanded 16.3%. This follows a contraction of 5.2% in 2020. As of 2021, total GDP in Lamar County, Texas was \$2,706,671,000.





Gross Domestic Product data are provided by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, imputed by Chmura where necessary, updated through 2021.

Of the sectors in Lamar County, Texas, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2021, \$1,223,428,000 The next-largest contributions came from Health Care and Social Assistance (\$236,795,000); Retail Trade (\$202,329,000); and Construction (\$156,816,000).
