Demographic Profile

The population in the Tyler Area was 742,442 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020. The region has a civilian labor force of 327,465 with a participation rate of 55.7%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Tyler Area, 19.5% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation. The median household income in the Tyler Area is \$54,540 and the median house value is \$143,059.



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Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for the Tyler Area was 3.8% as of October 2022. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 3.4%. One year earlier, in October 2021, the unemployment rate in the Tyler Area was 4.7%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through October 2022.

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Tyler Area earned annual wages of \$48,328 as of 2022Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 7.2% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$67,777 in the nation as of 2022Q2.

Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2022Q1 with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q2.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 6.5% lower in Tyler Area than the U.S. average.

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Tyler Area is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 35,663 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (30,833 workers) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (29,031). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Construction and Extraction Occupations (LQ = 1.36), Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.15), and Educational Instruction and Library Occupations (1.12).

Occupation groups in the Tyler Area with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$103,500), Management Occupations (\$90,300), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$80,100). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.3% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 7.9% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Tyler Area is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +2.1% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+518 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+311). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (4,943 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (4,081).



3. Data represent found online ads active within the last thirty days in the selected region; data represents a sampling rather than the complete universe of postings. Ads lacking zip code information but designating a place (city, town, etc.) may be assigned to the zip code with greatest employment in that place for queries in this analytic. Due to alternative county-assignment algorithms, ad counts in this analytic may not match that shown in RTI (nor in the popup window ad list).

Occupation employment data are estimated via industry employment data and the estimated industry/occupation mix. Industry employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2022Q1, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q2. Wages by occupation are as of 2021 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Tyler Area with the highest relative concentration is Coal/Oil/Power with a location quotient of 3.51. This cluster employs 8,538 workers in the region with an average wage of \$93,452. Employment in the Coal/Oil/Power cluster is projected to expand in the region about 1.5% per year over the next ten years.




Industry Clusters for Tyler Area as of 2022Q2

Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Tyler Area is projected to grow 0.8% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 1.2% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 1.0% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 1.0% per year.




Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Training Required


Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2021, nominal GDP in the Tyler Area expanded 10.5%. This follows a contraction of 7.1% in 2020. As of 2021, total GDP in the Tyler Area was \$30,743,882,000.



Gross Domestic Product data are provided by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, imputed by Chmura where necessary, updated through 2021.

Of the sectors in the Tyler Area, Health Care and Social Assistance contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2021, \$3,784,966,000 The next-largest contributions came from Manufacturing (\$3,608,130,000); Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$2,812,356,000); and Retail Trade (\$2,729,656,000).
