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## **Course Overview and Course Objectives:**

This course is a survey of European history from the 1300s to the early 1500s. It is designed for anyone with an interest in the topic. We will cover a variety of themes, including humanism and the legacy of medieval culture, statecraft and warfare, dynastic politics, overseas exploration, and religious, intellectual and artistic developments.

#### **Course Requirements:**

The course will consist of lectures and discussions; regular attendance and participation in class are essential. There will be a midterm exam, a final exam, and a term paper. Each of these is worth 1/3 of your final grade. The exams will consist of paragraph-long IDs (a choice of 5 out of 10 terms) and a longer essay. The paper will be a comparison of humanism and statecraft based on your reading of Machiavelli and Erasmus.

## **Grading Policy:**

Each of the three assignments is worth 100 points for a total of 300 points. Grading scale is
