## Criminal Justice Courses to Be Offered at the Longview University Center

The University of Texas at Tyler has scheduled two criminal justice courses to be offered through the Longview University Center this spring. The courses, *Introduction to American Policing Practices* (CRIJ 2332) and *Administrative Ethics* (CRIJ 5336) will be held 6 to 8:40 p.m. Tuesday nights.

Dr. David Scott, an experienced instructor and sergeant with the Longview Police Department, will lead students in the examination of critical issues faced by American police through analysis of research relating to the historical, sociological, and legal bases for policing with an emphasis on contemporary trends in law enforcement. The course will be held at the Longview University Center (LUC).

Administrative Ethics, a graduate level course, will be led by Dr. Peter Phillips. Students will study the ethical issues facing public and criminal justice administrators. Issues include the development of value systems, the nature of public duty, formulation of value-based decision making strategies, the importance of professional ethical standards, and the dangers of public corruption.

The course is required of candidates for the degrees of Master of Criminal Justice and Master of Public Administration. The course will be delivered to the LUC via interactive television.
