Rural Area -a geographic area that is located outside towns and cities The Health Resources and Services Administration of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services defines the word "rural" as encompassing "...all population, housing, and territory not included within an urban area. Whatever is not urban is considered rural. <https://datawarehouse.hrsa.gov/tools/analyzers/geo/Rural.aspx>. You can also use 2010 urban area file containing a list of

Underserved area: Generally determined through a review of client base. Sometimes based on # of Medicaid/subsidized patients seen in the clinic.
