COURSE DESCRIPTION:

NURS 5301: Students will follow steps 0-3 of the evidence-based practice (EBP) process. Students will answer clinical questions by critical appraisal of research and explore theoretical and ethical issues in translating evidence into practice as they begin assimilating in their advanced practice role in nursing.

PREQUISITES: Graduate student admission or faculty approval.

CREDIT HOURS: 3**STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

By the end of the course, each student will be able to:

1. Formulate a PICOT Question about a clinical issue.
2. Conduct a systematic search to find evidence to answer the clinical question.
3. Explain the nature of theory and conceptual frameworks within research.
4. Appraise the qualitative, quantitative, and mixed-methods evidence for rigor and use in practice.
5. Integrate ethical principles into planning, conduct, and implementation of research.
6. Articulate a personal philosophy toward assimilation of APRN, Nurse Educator, and Administrator role.

Turnitin is a feature provided by Canvas that is designed to detect plagiarism or non-original student work. The program checks your work against a comprehensive database of source material including previous students' work and other papers and materials found on the web. An originality report will be generated that indicates the percentage of non-original material (text that matches existing sources) found in your paper. The purpose of using Turnitin in your course is to ensure you are writing original papers and to encourage you and all students to properly attribute all sources used.
