 Nursing Administration Certificate Program

The Nursing Administration Certificate program prepares the master's-prepared nurse to apply leadership and management skills to become the essential link between the vision and mission of the larger health care organization and the unit-based system of patient care. Resource allocation expertise, using professional skills in assessing and analyzing health care needs in the practice setting, is developed.

This certificate program meets the education requirement for the American Nurses Credentialing Center's (ANCC) Nurse Executive Certification Eligibility.

Objectives

At the completion of the Nursing Administration Certificate Program, the graduate will be able to: 1) utilize essential knowledge and skills required in the role of the nurse administrator; and 2) successfully transition from the direct patient care role to the role of nurse administrator.

Completion of the Certificate

The successful completion of 9 semester credit hours is required to complete the certificate program (see courses listed below). Individuals receive college credit for each course completed. These courses will be listed on an official university transcript and a certificate of completion will be awarded.
