## 7.11 Unsafe Clinical Performance

(Revised 6/12/2022, reviewed 11/23)

Any act, omission, or commission that may result in harm to the patient is considered unsafe clinical practice. Unsafe clinical practice includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1. Harm or threats to harm the physical, psychological, microbiological, chemical, or thermal safety of a patient.
- 2. Disregard of previously mastered principles, learning, or objectives in carrying out nursing skills and/or delegated medical functions.
- 3. Lack of adherence to current CDC guidelines for infection control.
- 4. Failure to recognize one's own limitations, incompetence, and/or legal responsibilities.
- 5. Failure to accept moral and legal responsibility for one's own actions, thereby violating professional integrity as expressed in the Code of Nurses, Good Professional Character policy.
- 6. Arrival at a clinical setting in an impaired condition as determined by the clinical instructor.

**NOTE**: An evaluation denoting unsafe clinical performance results in immediate dismissal from the practicum experience with a failing grade. A failure in the clinical portion of the course results in failure of the course regardless of theory grades.
