1.0 NURS 3302: Medical Terminology

SEMESTER CREDIT HOURS

Three (3) hours didactic

PREREQUISITE: None.

1.1 COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This on-line course will introduce the student to the medical terms used throughout all healthcare settings. The course is designed to prepare the student to use the terms in the correct context, and to interpret the terminology used in the healthcare arena. In addition, the course content introduces the student to major disease processes, medical procedures, and various pharmacological agents used to treat disease.

1.2 STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

1. Identify personal learning style/styles and learn how to use individual learning styles to benefit learning, retaining, and testing of the course content.
2. Explore the origin of medical language used in the healthcare industry.
3. Identify, integrate and formulate basic medical terms using basic term components: prefix, root, combining forms, and suffix.
4. Identify and demonstrate understanding of common terms and abbreviations used in healthcare used to document in the medical record related to the major systems of the body.

- a. The course is set up in Medical Language Lab (MLL) 2.0. **ALL course** work is completed in MLL.
