

The poll you will assist in conducting will be in the field for two weeks, with the Polling Lab open for operation in the evenings between 4:30pm and 8:30pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, as well as a block of time from 1pm to 5pm on Saturdays and Sundays. You will be able to select shifts to work at one of the 20 stations during that time.

- Your participation will be assessed based on the hours you work (minimum 4 hours). The quality of your participation will reflect a ratio of the quality of your participation that reflects the number of calls made and the number of calls successfully completed. You will also be evaluated through observation of how clearly you communicate with respondents and complete the assigned tasks.
- You will also be asked to journal (<u>up to</u> one page per shift) your experiences, offering a daily reflection on the similarities and differences of respondent attitudes recorded during the surveys you completed. What combinations of views were unexpected? What is your assessment of the political knowledge of respondents you spoke with? What messages from the media or campaigns are being reflected back in the answers of the individuals you spoke with?

Upon submission of this daily journal of your polling experience add an introduction of the main themes you recognized and a conclusion about the value of these reflections as evidence of the larger themes you recognized. In your conclusion, you may also want to add reflections about topics respondents wanted to talk about beyond the survey and offer advice on how the next survey could address those concerns.


