## **Campus Accessibility Initiatives**

- Faculty Senate and the University are collaborating to improve campus walkability.
- A new pathway was added between the Stewart Administration Building and the Business Building.
- A second pathway is being developed to connect the Alumni House to the main campus.
- Student Government Association is identifying additional areas needing improved access.
- Efforts are being made to enhance navigation for the growing student population.

## **Transportation Updates**

- The City of Tyler transit system is free for faculty, staff, and students with a valid ID.
- The previous bus system was ineffective due to long, looping routes.
- The city has transitioned to a micro-transit system where riders can hail a bus via an app.
- The system provides direct transportation to designated bus stops within a zone. **Signage and Mapping Improvements**
- A university committee, led by Jeff Noblet, is working on improving campus maps.
- The initiative includes high-quality, interactive digital maps with turn-by-turn navigation.
- Efforts are underway to improve physical signage with clear and informative displays.
- Plans for indoor signage are also being discussed.

#### Shuttle and Parking Considerations

- Faculty Senate is exploring potential shuttle services to support students traveling across campus.
- Previous shuttle implementations failed due to inefficient route planning.
- A proposed pilot program would run point-to-point routes for students needing reliable transport.
- Faculty and staff parking alternatives, such as an off-campus lot with a dedicated shuttle, were discussed.
- Some faculty members suggested adjusting parking permit pricing based on distance from campus.

### **Alternative Transportation Options**

- A bike loan program is in place, and additional bikes are being considered for expansion.
- A previous bike share program was unsuccessful due to poor maintenance and tracking.
- Scooter rentals with geofencing capabilities are being explored as a potential alternative.
- Data indicates that demand exists for alternative transportation among students.

### **Student Needs Assessment**

- Many students, especially international and graduate students, do not own cars.
- Faculty Senate is working with the Health Science Center to address transportation needs between campuses.
- Some students are using personal funds for Uber rides due to a lack of shuttle services.
- A survey is being developed to assess transportation and accessibility needs.

### Faculty and Staff Onboarding

- Collaboration with HR is underway to enhance the onboarding experience for new employees.
- Efforts include improving training modules, streamlining campus navigation guidance, and making compliance training more accessible.
- Focus is on a structured approach to ensure all employees receive necessary resources and information.
