- Dr. Michael Tidwell: Introducing himself to USAC. Appreciates the staff's great work and understands staff doesn't always get recognition; he wants to help how he can. At the end of the day, he is the authority because he is held accountable. Q-Any talk about better signage at the entrances of campus? A-Yes, they will be redone to be easier read, and reflective at night. The alumni house is now the main entrance's focus and signage will enhance that. A new campus master plan will follow the strategic plan. We obviously need more housing; we are at 98% capacity and are expected to reach 100% at school start. We need to make campus more attractive to increase the traditional campus feel. Dr. Tidwell's Q to USAC-What do we think about the Patriots/Eagles/Swoop confused mascot conundrum? Conversation: this will eventually be changed to be consistent. Most likely the eagle will stick, but it was mentioned that Patriots is so closely tied to branding, such as the @patriots.uttyler email domain and other web branding. Hawks were suggested since they are a big part of our campus
- Parking Tags Dr. Howard Patterson. Wanted to get USAC's option about a parking tag to hang from rearview mirrors instead of a sticker. This could be moved from vehicle to vehicle with no penalty.
