When: Three wonderful weeks – Monday, 11 May to Sunday, 31 May 2015 (plus some on campus meetings at UT Tyler before departure).



Who: Undergraduate Political Science majors and minors, students seeking to graduate and or undergraduate credit, and the general community.

Where: Beautiful Cambodia – Phnom Penh, Sihanoukville, and Siem Reap.

What: You will spend quality time getting to know the people, culture, and communities. You will spend real time helping and working with children in need while learning about the religions, history, politics, and larger society – and yourself. You will visit many NGOs – you may even find your future employment/occupation.

Credit Hours: Earn 3 credit hours in POLS 3388 or UNIV 4368 or UNIV 5368.

Support: Regular financial aid opportunities apply. In addition, some scholarships may be available through UT Tyler / The Office of International Programs and other sources.

Estimated cost: \$4100 covers round trip airfare, lodging, and several meals, and fees. Tyler tuition for POLS/ UNIV 4368 or 5368 is additional (full balance due in the Cashier's Office by 1 April 2015).
